Call for Abstracts

The EAACI Congress 2016 Scientific Programme Committee and the Local Organising Committee welcome the submission of original contributions for oral and poster presentations.

Abstract Submission

Abstract submission will open on 26 October 2015. The deadline to submit abstracts is 10 January 2016. Notifications of acceptance or rejection of abstracts will be sent to the corresponding author of the abstract by the beginning of March 2016. Abstract Regulations

- Abstracts can only be submitted electronically on the Congress website.
- Authors can present more than one abstract.
- Authors can be the co-author of more than one abstract.
- Submission of closely related topics by the same group is discouraged.
- Abstracts will only be considered for presentation if they are not published or submitted for presentation elsewhere.
- All abstracts must be written and presented in English.
- It is the presenting author's responsibility to submit a correct abstract.

Congress Scholarship

The EAACI Congress 2016 and the Local Organising Committee offer 100 Congress Scholarships to EAACI Junior Members. A scholarship application can only be made in connection with an abstract submission and must be applied for by the presenting author of an abstract. The application deadline is 10 January 2016. As a Congress Scholarship recipient you will receive complimentary registration to the Congress, as well as shared accommodation in a twin-bedded room (up to four nights) and have travel costs refunded up to EUR 500.

EAACI Abstract Award

All abstract presenters automatically enter the competition for the EAACI abstract award of EUR 200. The award **winners will be announced** at the EAACI booth during the Congress and on the website.

Registration

The presenting author of an abstract must register for the Congress by 15 April 2016. Until this date the presenting author is offered a prolonged "early fee". All presenting authors must be registered before this date in order to publish their abstract in the abstract book and the Congress programme. The registration fee may be refunded if the abstract is rejected.

Presentations

Accepted abstracts will be presented in Oral Abstract Sessions, Poster Discussion Sessions and Thematic Poster Sessions.

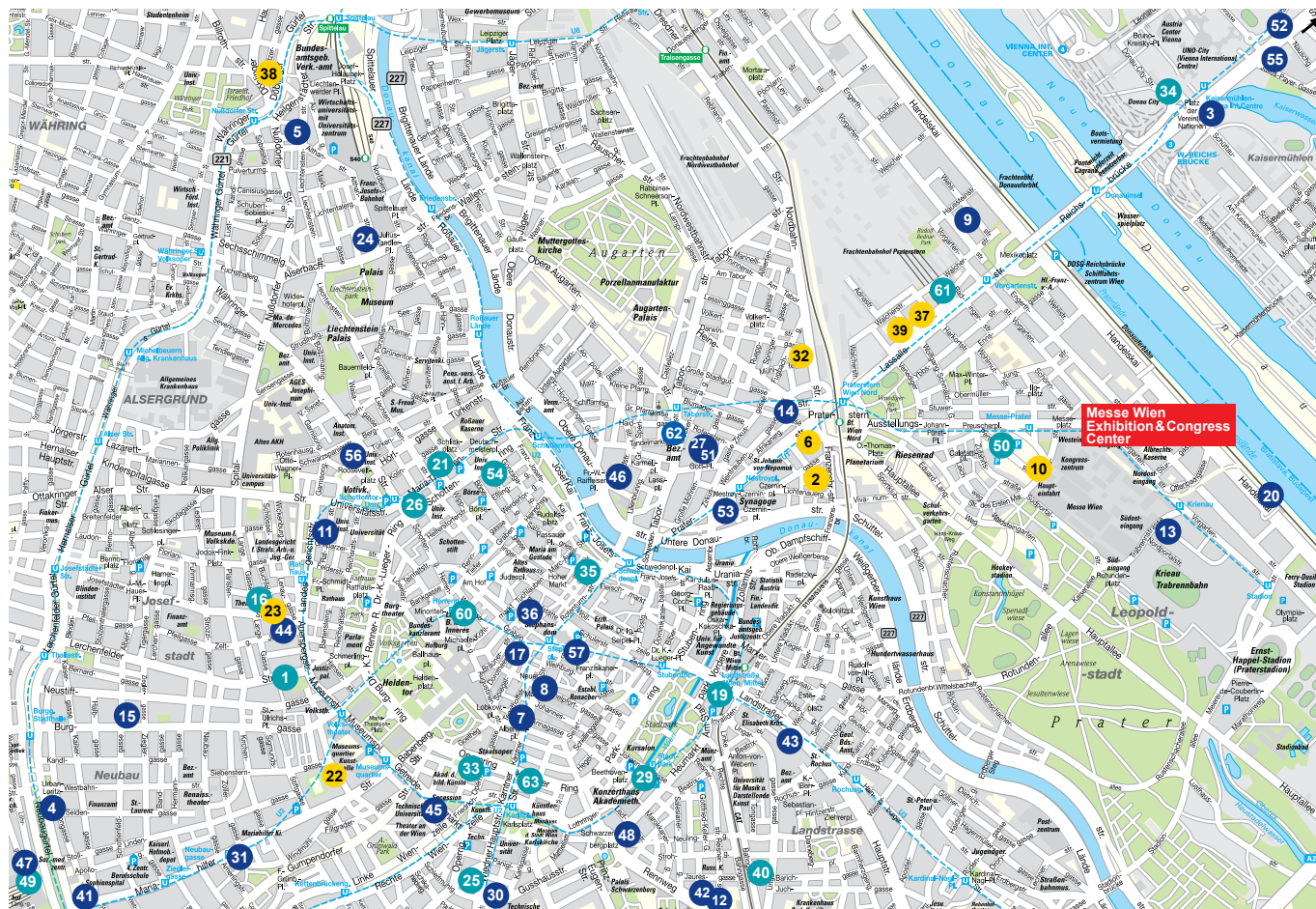
