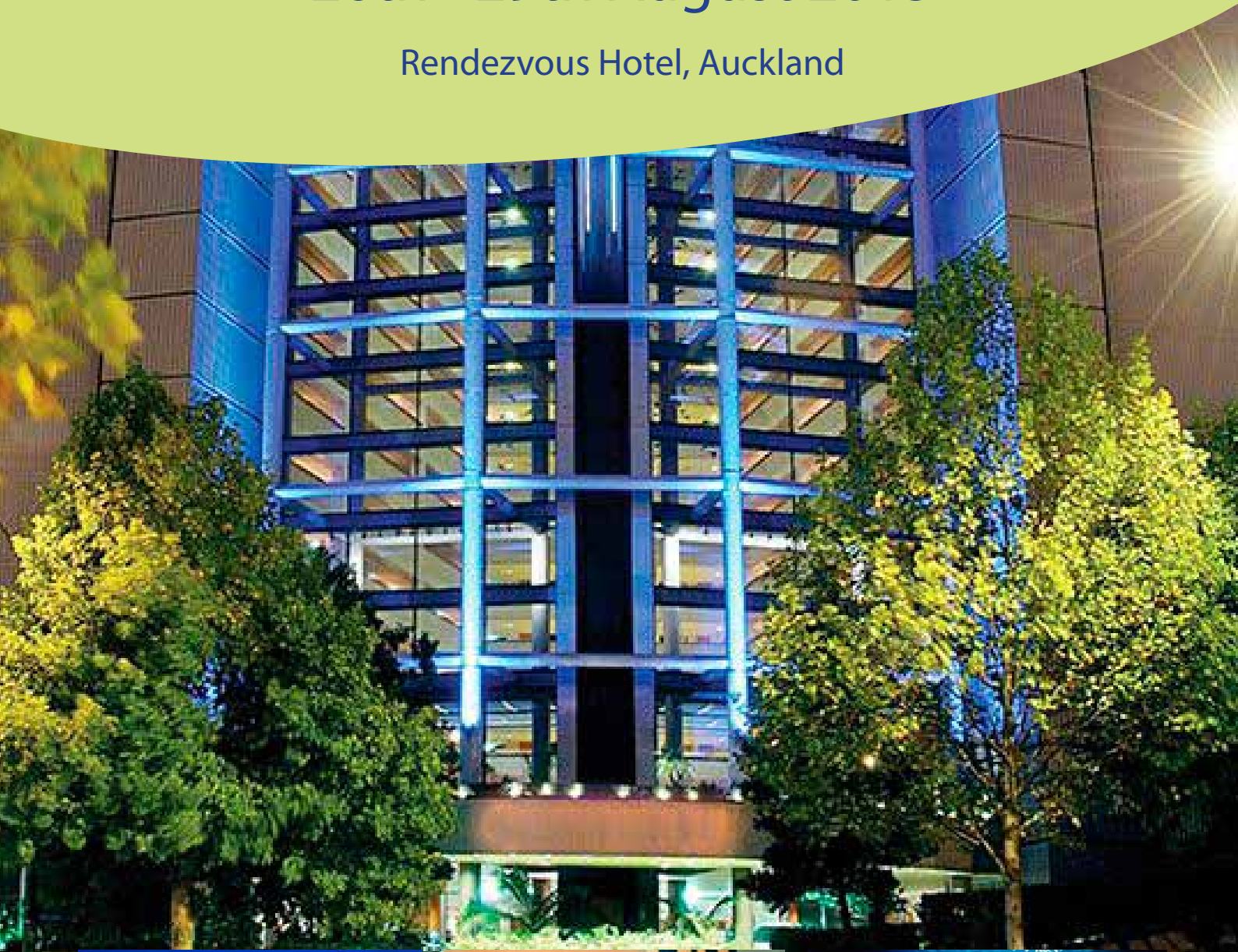

Keynote Speakers



Christian Baum

Dr. Baum is an Assistant Professor in the Department of Dermatology at the Mayo Clinic in Rochester, Minnesota. He graduated from medical school at the University of Iowa. Following his residency at the University of Iowa Hospitals and Clinics, he received fellowship training in Mohs Surgery and Cutaneous Oncology at the University of Iowa Hospitals and Clinics under the

direction of Christopher Arpey. He currently enjoys a practice that focuses on cutaneous oncology, reconstruction, and resident and fellow education. His research interests include melanoma, spindle-cell tumors, and squamous cell carcinoma

I am author or co-author of 8 chapters in various Dermatology/ Dermatopathology/Pathology Textbooks including Rook's Textbook of Dermatology, Lever's Histopathology of the Skin and Fletcher's Diagnostic Histopathology of Tumors. I was the co-editor of the third edition of McKee's book "Pathology of the Skin with Clinical Correlations" published in February 2005. The book became the biggest bestselling book in dermatopathology and has won prizes from The Royal Society of Medicine and The British Medical Association. I am now the main editor of the fourth edition of the book, which was published in September 2011.

I have been involved in over 200 publications in the field of dermatopathology and soft tissue tumours. I have recently co-authored a Histopathology Atlas of Melanocytic Lesions co-authored with Dr Phillip McKee. The book was published in February 2009.

I am member of the editorial board of The American Journal of Dermatopathology, Histopathology and Clinical and Experimental Dermatology. I am also co-editor of the section on Continual Professional Development in Clinical and Experimental Dermatology and editor of the dermatopathology section of Histopathology and British Journal of Dermatology.

I was President of the British Society of Dermatopathology from 2011 until 2014.
