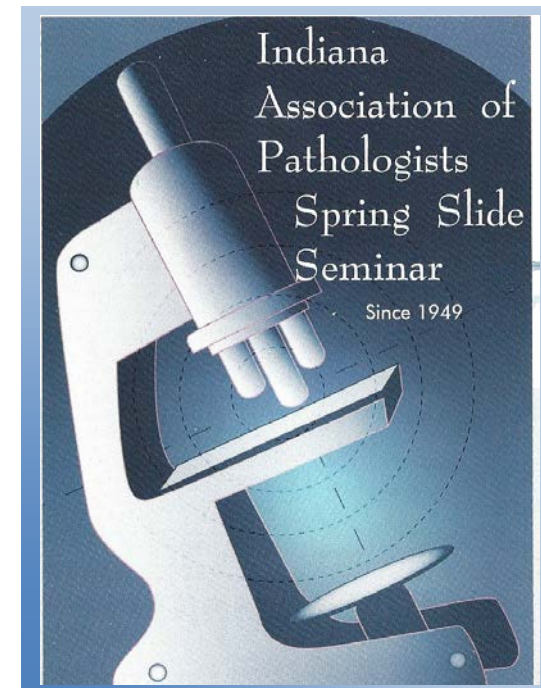

The pathologic features of kidney and bladder tumors are gaining increasing significance in patient management decisions. The course is designed to produce changes in physicians resulting in improved knowledge and competency in classification of renal cell carcinomas.

The 2016 World Health Organization kidney tumor classification has recently been released. Renal cell carcinomas should be reported using this classification. It is important that pathologists correctly classify renal cell carcinomas.

Specific variant histology of urothelial carcinoma recognized in the 2016 WHO classification should be reported when present.

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Format

This live CME activity combines lecture and slide case presentations, with opportunity for discussion during an all-day session. Attendees receive learning feedback with the use of an audience response system. Attendees may also take an online SAMs quiz for American Board of Pathology approved credit.

He currently is the Treasurer and a member of the Executive Committee of the USCAP. He is a member of the editorial board of several journals including Modern Pathology. In 2016 Dr. Grignon was awarded the Koss medal by the International Society of Urologic Pathology for lifelong contributions to the field of urologic pathology.
