ABSTRACT SUBMISSION

There is no limit to the number of abstracts an individual may submit. Please note that the scientific committee may limit the number of oral presentations for one individual.

All abstracts must be written in **English** (A4 page in Word format, Times 12 pts, spaced 1.5), the body text is limited to a maximum of **250 words**, and consist of the following sections:

- Title of the abstract: ALL CAPITALS;
- Authors (e.g. AB Popescu, DE Popovic), presenting author always first;
- Organization(s): e.g. University of Zagreb, School of Medicine, Zagreb, Croatia;
- Body (with optional sub-sections): Introduction; Methods; Results and discussion; Research support (Conflict of interest disclosure).

No tables, figures or references can be included in the abstracts. Submitted papers cannot be later edited.

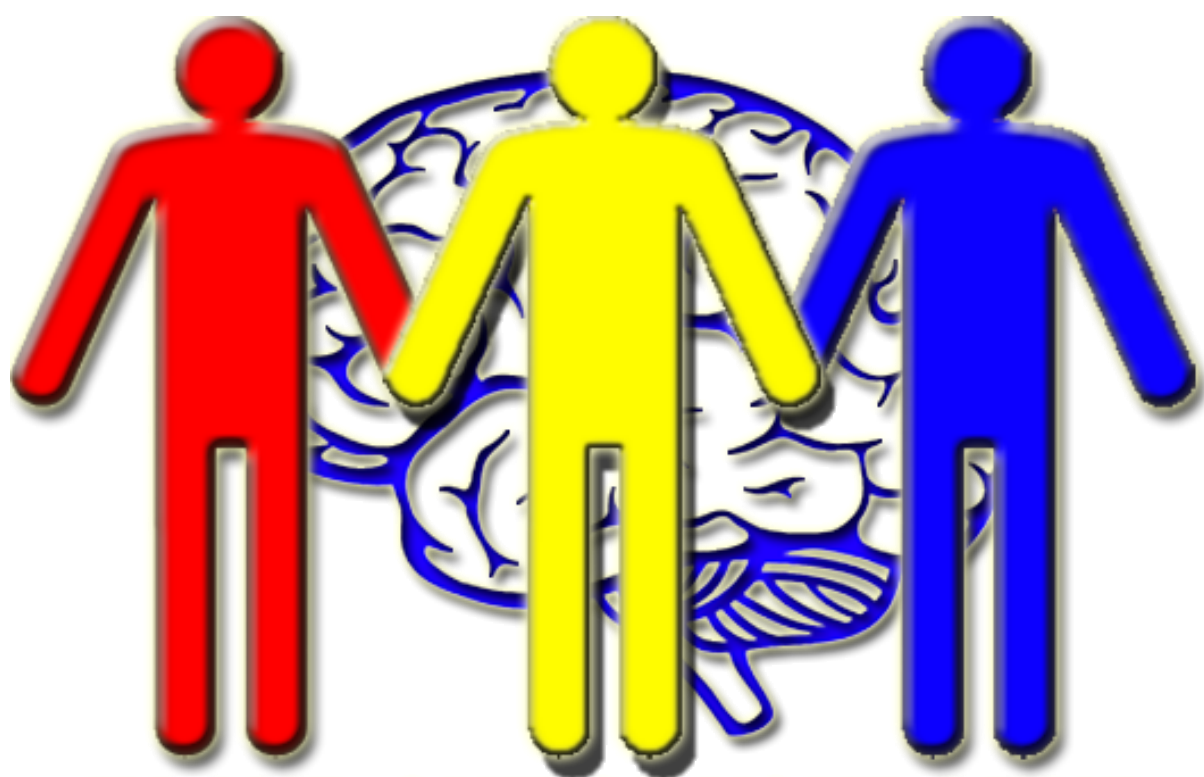
All abstracts will be presented as **oral presentations** during the sessions of the Conference. If a submitted abstract is accepted for the scientific program, the presenter must pay the registration fee to present the paper by July 1st, 2021. Presenters of multiple papers need to register only once.

By submitting a paper or extended abstract for review, the author agrees that it will be published in the abstracts book if the final document is accepted. Publishing copyrights will be held by organizers.

Abstracts will be submitted by email to: conference@mhasee.ro. All abstracts had to arrive by June 11th, 2021 (at 23:59:59 CET). Authors of accepted abstracts will be notified by the Scientific Committee before July 1st, 2021.
