Course Description:

The Society for Airway Management (SAM) is comprised of a multidisciplinary group of health care providers from Anesthesiology, Emergency Medicine, Otolaryngology, Critical Care, and Pulmonology, as well as CRNAs, paramedics and nurses. The **21st SAM Annual Scientific Meeting and Workshop** has been developed to feature international experts in the various fields of medicine dealing with airway management. Many aspects of difficult airway management, in a variety of clinical settings, will be highlighted. This course will consist of plenary presentations, small group round table discussions, a hands-on workshop including a patient simulator session, and poster rounds. 6. Discuss airway management strategies of the parturient
7. Discuss what journal editors are looking for in airway management manuscripts

Target Audience: Anesthesiologists, emergency medicine physicians, otolaryngologists, intensivists, trauma surgeons, paramedics, certified registered nurse anesthetists, flight nurses and all other allied health professionals assisting with airway management should attend.

Call for Challenging Case Reports!: SAM is proud to announce the call for Case Reports to be submitted for the new 'Challenging Cases' Panel session, during the 2018 SAM Annual Meeting in Chicago. Case report abstracts, indicated by the submitter as particularly challenging and high-yield for learning, will undergo review and judging by the SAM Abstract Committee. Individuals with the Top 5 Challenging Reports will be invited to present their cases to an expert panel during Session 10 on Sunday, September 16th. Those containing elucidatory images and/or video* are encouraged and will be preferentially considered.

SAM is seeking case reports that make an important teaching point or scientific observation in airway management. This often includes description of novel approaches, airway management techniques, use of equipment, and new or instructive information.

Case reports have introduced new paradigms, increased awareness of clinicians to complications, and have likely saved countless lives. They have also sparked ideas for clinical studies. The SAM Board of Directors acknowledges the contributions of challenging cases in the past by our members to advance our discipline. As a result, we encourage you to submit a challenging reports for consideration for our Annual Meeting in Chicago!

Airway on Demand (AOD) is an A-to-Z update of the current trends in clinical airway management designed for the practicing anesthesiologist. The course will cover topics such as the new ASA difficult airway guidelines, advanced airway evaluation, pediatric airway management, awake intubation, new video laryngoscopes, the role of new supraglottic airways in difficult airway management, invasive airway access and difficult extubation. AOD is being offered to the clinician who wants a solid review of the current devices and techniques, before attending SAM, where more advanced ideas are shared.

Educational Objectives:

Participants who attend this course will be able to:

1. Develop an appropriate airway management plan based on the findings of a focused medical history and airway physical exam, and apply these plans to patient care.
 2. Apply principles of advanced airway evaluation to the synthesis of an appropriate airway plan.
 3. Assess their plan of airway rescue and routine tracheal intubation with the incorporation of modern optical/video devices.
 4. Assess their plan of airway rescue and routine airway management with the incorporation of modern supraglottic airways.
 5. Apply patient preparation techniques in the performance of awake tracheal intubation.
 6. Apply techniques of minimally invasive airway rescue.
 7. Evaluate the potential for failed tracheal extubation and develop a plan for emergency reintubation.
