Abstract submission deadline: Monday, January 15, 2018

Who can submit abstracts?

Anyone who has interest in cancer health disparities and would like to showcase their work with other professionals with similar interest can submit their project reports, clinical research, or basic science research related to cancer health disparities.

Project managers, public-health students, community health educators, and others involved and interested in cancer health disparities are welcome to submit their project reports, case studies or other research for presentation at #SCHD18.

Five travel awards are available for top scoring abstracts.

What's the requirement?

- Abstracts should not have been previously published or presented at another conference
- Abstracts must be written in English in the format provided
- Abstracts should be 300 words or less
- All authors' names, credentials, institutional affiliation, and email addresses must be listed.

You don't have to be a healthcare provider to present your abstract at #SCHD18.

Whether you are presenting your research paper on cancer health disparities or you are participating in this Summit to hear the experts discuss and debate the current issues related to cancer health disparities and potential approaches to minimizing those disparities, this Summit will be an opportunity for you to contribute toward making cancer care accessible and

2016 - Established a home hospice program in Patan, Nepal. Partnered with the government of Madhya Pradesh, India to start a home hospice program in that state.

2017 - Started the Northwest Cancer Summit and the "Advancing Cancer Care for the Economically Stressed (BTF ACCES) program in Washington State.
