GOALS & OBJECTIVES

Why You Should Attend:

CVI's 7th Annual EP/Arrhythmia Management Update focuses on updates in electrophysiology of which everyone in clinical practice should be aware to provide outstanding care and improve outcomes for patients with arrhythmias and various electrophysiologic syndromes. Our program focuses on: AF lessons learned from ablation, detecting and developing effective anticoagulation strategies for Silent AF, managing the post AF ablation patient, historical perspectives on heart rhythm management, leadless pacing, His bundle pacing, and recognizing and fixing device malfunctions. - Identify electrocardiographic findings that might suggest device malfunction
