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The SSAT Maintenance of Certification Course will be held in conjunction with Digestive Disease Week® (DDW), the combined Annual Meetings of the AASLD, AGA, ASGE, and the SSAT. The date of DDW® is May 18 –21, 2013.



COURSE GOAL

The 2013 SSAT Maintenance of Certification Course is the third in a three-year cycle of courses that will help fulfill Part II MOC requirements for surgeons. This year's course focuses on evidence based treatment of colorectal diseases. Lectures by experts will be combined with panel discussions and case presentations to highlight key issues.

This activity is designed to address the following ABMS/IOM competencies:

- Patient Care or Patient-Centered Care
- Medical Knowledge
- System-Based Practice
- Quality Improvement

TARGET AUDIENCE

The target audience includes general surgeons with a substantial component of GI (and, specifically, colorectal) surgery as well as Advanced-Learner GI surgeons who must maintain their ABS certification.

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FORMAT

The course will be divided into six sessions and at the conclusion of the course participants will be able to:

1. COLORECTAL CANCER

- Discuss the merits of multidisciplinary rectal cancer treatment and the pros and cons of centralization of services.
- Explain the role of SILS technology in the treatment of colorectal cancer.
- Gauge risk of neoplasia in patients with inflammatory bowel disease and better understand decision analysis in these patients.

2. INFLAMMATORY AND INFECTIOUS BOWEL DISEASE

- Identify the indications for surgical intervention in patients with Crohns disease and ulcerative colitis
- Describe the clinical presentation and medical treatment options for C difficile colitis and when surgical therapy is indicated.

3. PELVIC FLOOR AND RELATED DISORDERS

- Name some of the current controversies in the management of complex pelvic floor disorders.

4. LUNCH AT THE MOVIES

- Describe the key steps in minimally invasive colorectal procedures.
- Recognize the indications and contraindications for single access and robotic colon and rectal surgical procedures.

5. COLORECTAL EMERGENCIES

- Discuss the indications for nonoperative management of perforated diverticulitis
- Describe the role for endoluminal stenting in management of large bowel obstructions.
- Explain the role of advanced radiologic imaging in patients with complex perineal infections.
- Identify the indications for primary anastomosis vs. diversion in patients with colorectal trauma.

6. NEW TECHNOLOGIES AND TECHNIQUES

- Describe emerging technology applicable to the treatment of colorectal conditions.
- Review the results of new surgical techniques used to treat colorectal cancer.
