DESCRIPTION

This course will review the latest treatment modalities in uveitis including the intravitreal delivery systems for long acting and short acting steroids and the various anti-tumor necrosis factor alpha agents. We will compare these new treatments to the currently accepted systemic immunosuppression regimens with steroids and non-steroidal immunosuppressive therapy. Updates on infectious uveitis syndromes will be presented. Case presentations with emphasis on audience interaction will provide insight on how to conduct a uveitis work up and how to treat various syndromes.

OBJECTIVES

At the conclusion of this course, participants will be able to:

- 1. Describe the use of nonspecific drugs including immunosuppressive therapy.
- 2. Describe current clinical trials in ocular inflammatory diseases.
- 3. Identify newer therapies for non-infectious posterior uveitis syndromes.
- 4. Discuss evaluation and treatment of patients with uveitis.
