PASSPORT AND VISA INFORMATION

Passports are REQUIRED for every passenger including children. If you do not have a passport, please allow a minimum of 4-6 weeks to receive it after you complete and mail the application. **Your passport cannot expire before January 26, 2014.**

It is the sole responsibility of the guest to identify and obtain all required travel documents and have them available when necessary. These appropriate valid travel documents such as passports, visas, inoculation certificates, and/or family legal documents are required for ship boarding and country entry and/or re-entry into the United States and other countries. Based on nationality, the U.S. and Canada may require an entry visa.

Guests who do not possess the proper documentation may be prevented from boarding their flight or ship, or from entering a country, and may be subject to fines.

Note: No refunds will be given to individuals who fail to bring proper documentation.

GROUND TRANSPORTATION
