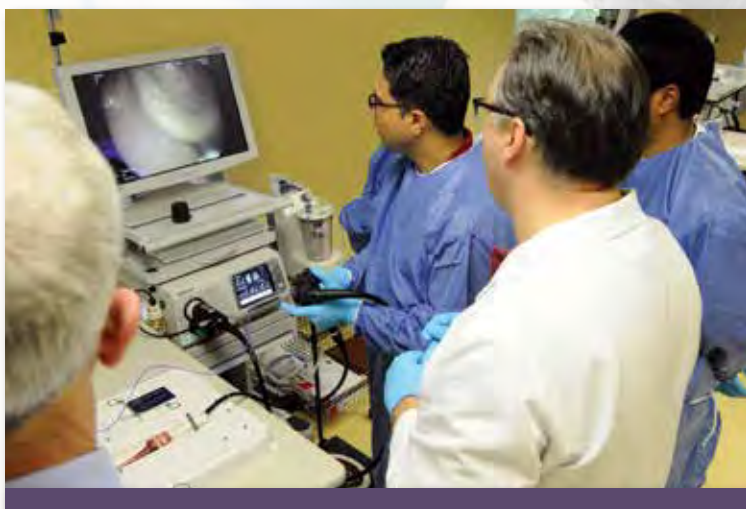

Advancing Techniques in Colonoscopy and Colon Emergencies

Course Description

This course is designed to improve endoscopic practice using a three-pronged approach to learning — didactic lectures, video demonstrations and hands-on training sessions under the tutelage of expert endoscopy educators at the ASGE Institute for Training and Technology. The goal is to help endoscopists enhance the quality of their colonoscopy with the latest science and technology in preps, insertion, detection and resection of polyps. This course will address the management of colon emergencies, including bleeding and acute obstruction.

Learning Objectives

Upon completion of this educational activity, participants will be able to:

- Discuss the advantages and disadvantages of various bowel preparations for different patient populations.
- Discuss quality measures for colonoscopy and how these can be utilized to enhance colonoscopy practice.
- Apply colonoscopy techniques for the diagnosis and treatment of large-volume, lower GI bleeding.
- Describe the role of colonoscopy in the management of acute colonic obstruction and pseudo-obstruction.
- Increase their polyp detection rates through the use of image-enhancement, chromoendoscopy, caps, water immersion retro scopes and optimal withdrawal techniques.
- Resect large and flat adenomas with confidence, using a variety of techniques and tools, including saline injection, endoloops and epinephrine injection, and piecemeal and en bloc mucosal resection.
- Reduce post-polypectomy complication rates through use of APC, clip hemostasis and closure techniques.

Intended Audience

Practicing gastrointestinal endoscopists and surgeons, as well as other practitioners interested in advancing their knowledge of colonoscopy and colon emergencies.
