## TARGET AUDIENCE

This activity is designed for primary care physicians, nurse practitioners, physician assistants and nurses who are often the first source of information for patients with gastroenterology and hepatology diseases. These professionals must have current information to appropriately diagnose, treat, refer, and counsel their patients.

## EDUCATIONAL NEED

This conference is knowledge based and designed to change physician competence. We have identified opportunities for education about a broad range of gastroenterology and hepatology digestive disease topics based on feedback from past participants and physician needs assessment surveys. - Discuss the workup and treatment plan for patients with GERD
- Define Barrett's Esophagus and when to refer for surveillance and/or treatment of this disease
- Identify the appropriate diagnostic test for different clinical presentations of *Helicobacter pylori* as well as the limitations of treatment

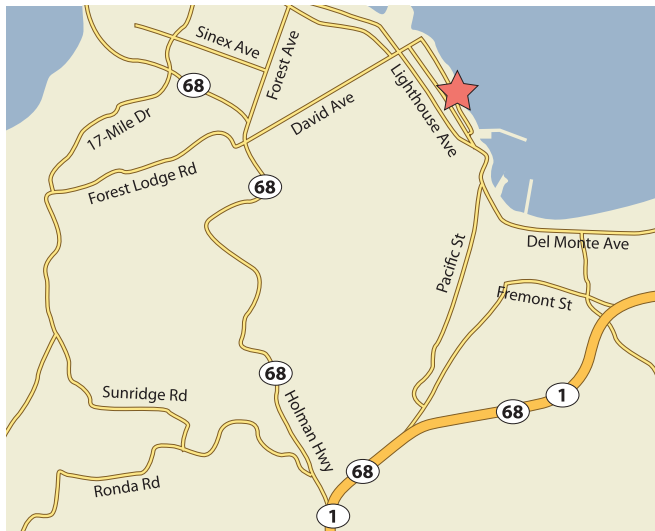
