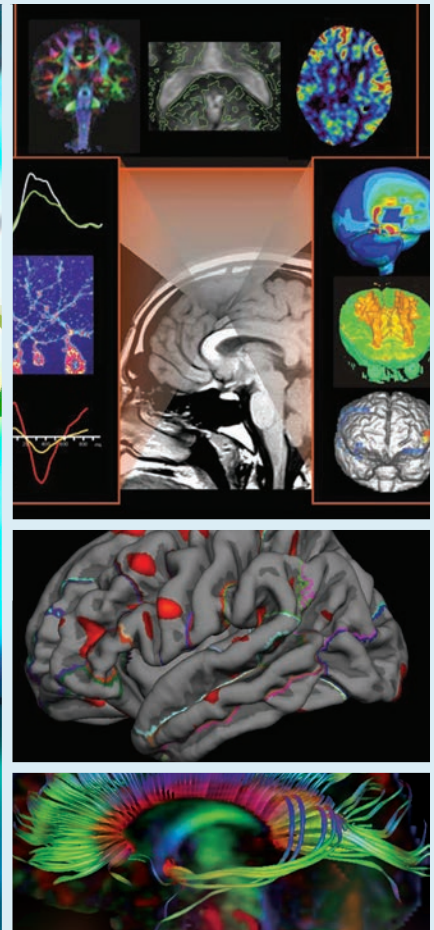

EDUCATIONAL NEED

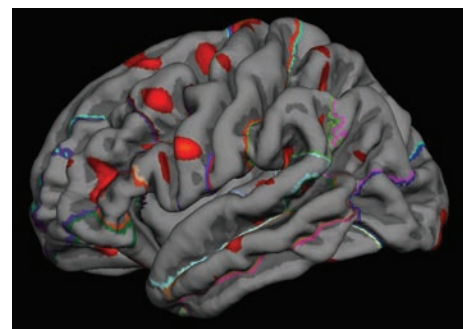
This year's conference on psychotic disorders has been designed to respond to areas of need as identified through past conference evaluations and annual needs assessment surveys of participants. The conference is knowledge and experience-based and designed to update participants on important new approaches to the treatment of psychotic disorders and clinical high-risk states. Content will address educational or practice gaps in the areas of:

- Impact of Cannabis on Mental Health
- New Brain Stimulation Techniques
- Virtual Reality and Technology in Psychiatry
- Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (CBT)
- Bipolar Disorder in First Episode Psychosis

EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES

At the end of the activity, participants should be able to:

- Summarize current understanding on the effects of cannabis in mental health
- Discuss the indications and principles underlying the use of cognitive behavior therapy (CBT) in psychotic disorders
- Discuss the impact of CBT on clinical and functional outcomes
- Summarize new developments in brain stimulation including the mechanism of action, and the role in the treatment of depression, psychosis and traumatic brain injury
- Evaluate how the use of new technologies such as virtual reality and telehealth are changing the practice of psychiatry
- Summarize key issues in the diagnosis and treatment of Bipolar Disorder in youth presenting with a first episode of psychosis



CONFERENCE REGISTRATION

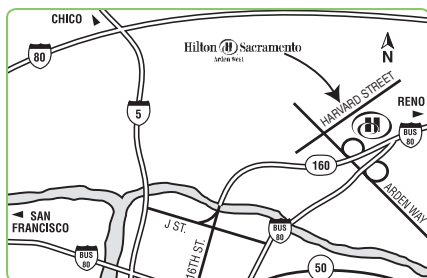
