Driving Directions

To/From Austin Bergstrom Airport (approx 20 miles/30 minutes):

Exit airport, follow Hwy 71 East for approx 13 miles. Entrance to resort is immediate next left AFTER traffic light at Pope Bend Rd. Turn left onto main drive and follow three mile drive to the lobby entrance.

From Bastrop

Take Hwy 71 west for approx 9 miles. Main entrance to resort is immediate next right after McKinney Roughs Nature Park. Turn right onto main drive and follow three mile drive to lobby entrance.

From Houston and Points East

From the 610 Loop, take 290 west, 110 miles, passing through Brenham/Giddings to 21W (just past Paige). Turn left at 21W. Go approx 13 miles to Hwy 95 in Bastrop. Turn left at Hwy 95, .4 miles to Hwy 71. Turn right at Hwy 71 and travel 10.5 miles. Main entrance to resort is immediate next right after McKinney Roughs Nature Park. From Dallas / Fort Worth and Points North
