NEUROINTERVENTIONAL WORKSHOP

September 6, 2013 / UCSF China Basin Research Center

The primary purpose of the course is to enable subspecialty interventional neuroradiologists, neurosurgeons, and neurologists to improve imaging interpretation of the brain, spine and vascular systems. This will be achieved by providing an updated review of evidence-based practice, with particular emphasis on neurovascular diseases, such as aneurysms, arteriovenous fistulas, arteriovenous malformations, acute ischemic stroke, and atherosclerosis; as well as novel and emerging technologies, such as physiologic imaging, advanced angiography, and state-of-the-art interventional devices.

Earn Self-Assessment Credit An opportunity for completion of a Self-Assessment activity will be offered. “Endovascular and Ischemic Stroke” is pending approval by the American Board of Radiology for 1 SA-CME credit and for meeting the criteria for self-assessment toward the purpose of fulfilling requirements in the ABR Maintenance of Certification program. As of January 1, 2013, updated MOC Part 2 requirements: 75 CME credits every three years, at least 25 of which must be self-assessment activities (SA-CME). For further information: www.theabr.org.

At the completion of this course, the attendee should be able to:

1. Improve performance and interpretation of neurovascular imaging studies;
2. Recognize the uses and limitations of CT, MRI, and digital subtraction angiography for stroke and intracranial hemorrhage imaging and treatment guidance;
3. Differentiate between the various common and rare forms of adult and pediatric neurovascular disease;
4. Understand the uses of coils, stents, flow diverters, liquid embolics, sclerosants, particulate embolics in the management of complex neurovascular disease;
5. Recommend appropriate management of complex neurovascular disease, with particular reference to the roles of endovascular evaluation and therapy.

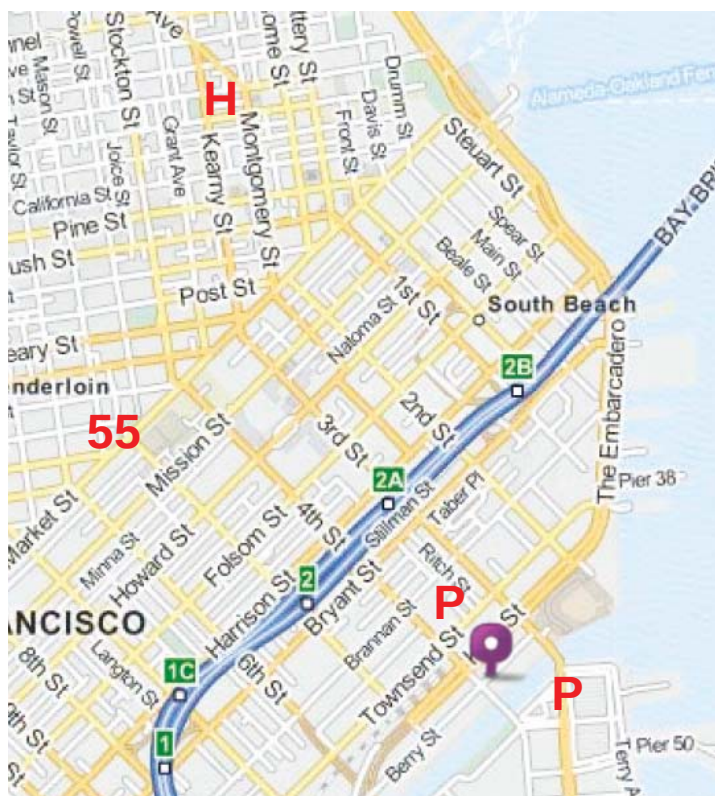
