Goal

This international symposium will focus on providing updated information about the roles of stereotactic radiotherapy including stereotactic radiosurgery and stereotactic body radiation therapy in the management of cancers. Many of the presentations are geared towards cutting-edge technology, updated clinical data/protocols and sources of controversy. The practitioners attending this symposium will obtain current knowledge about indications, techniques, controversies and future research directions using stereotactic radiotherapy. Our symposium is intended to improve practitioner knowledge and performance, clinical management, and research.

Educational Objectives

After attending this conference, participants should be able to

- Interpret the evolving clinical indications and patient selection criteria for stereotactic radiotherapy (*Knowledge, Competence*);
- Illustrate the potential toxicities, particularly severe long-term side effects such as grade 3 and above pneumonitis, hemoptysis, fistulae, chest wall pain, rib fracture, neuropathy and the approaches to minimize them (*Knowledge, Competence*);
- Implement the cutting-edge technology used to manage tumor motion and optimize stereotactic radiotherapy design and delivery to improve patient care (*Knowledge, Competence, Performance, Patient Outcomes*);
- Explore novel concepts of combining stereotactic radiotherapy with immune and/or molecular target therapy in locally advanced and metastatic cancers (*Knowledge, Competence*); and
- Debate about the controversies and discuss ongoing research projects and future research directions (*Knowledge*).

Physicians, Physicists, biologists, dosimetrists, fellows, trainees, postdoctoral, nurses and other health care professionals are encouraged to submit abstracts for poster presentations for the International Stereotactic Radiotherapy Symposium conference for health care professionals.

Abstracts will be accepted for the following categories:

1. Clinical projects related to stereotactic radiosurgery or stereotactic body radiotherapy
2. Physics and planning projects related to planning optimization, quality assurance and delivery of stereotactic radiotherapy
3. Biological studies related to hypofractionated radiotherapy, immunotherapy and target therapy

Abstract Instructions

Abstracts will be screened for relevance to stereotactic radiotherapy optimization, novel technologies, quality assurance, image-guided delivery, combination with biological treatment and biological mechanisms.

Structure abstracts using the following mandatory format:

- Purpose or Background, Methods, Results, and Conclusions.
If not applicable to your abstract, make a note of it in the appropriate section of the abstract.
- The entire abstract (title and body) must not exceed 2,000 characters (not including spaces), which is approximately 300-350 words.
- Limit poster abstracts to one page, typed single-spaced on plain 8.5 x 11 inch paper.
- Abbreviations may be used if they are spelled out or defined at the first mention.
- One table, graph, or illustration may be included in the abstract.

Submission Instructions

Please include the name of the conference, title of your presentation, author's full name, highest degree, mailing address, and institutional affiliation. Also, please include author's telephone, fax, and e-mail information. The conference executive committee will select abstracts for poster and/or possible oral presentation on the basis of their scientific merit and content quality. If selected, you will receive a confirmation letter with detailed information about the poster session. The content of the abstracts will not be edited. Freestanding 4' x 8' display boards will be provided for displaying posters. Certification of your presentation will be issued if your abstract is selected to present.
