

## Course Description

The Women's Health Symposium will provide current clinical information in the areas of reproduction, maternal-fetal medicine, gynecologic oncology & other aspects of health/wellness specific to women. The symposium will utilize didactic sessions that will include discussion of clinical guidelines, case studies to illustrate decision making & management, & interactive techniques utilizing audience response systems. The targeted audience is Physicians, Nurse Practitioners, Physician's Assistants, & nurses involved in the care of women.

## Course objectives

- Summarize the differential diagnosis for common rectal complaints in women, recognize rectal complaints that warrant further work-up, and discuss treatment options & when to refer to a general surgeon.
- Define the impact of obesity on risk of fetal malformations in growth pathology, review the risk for antepartum, intrapartum, & postpartum complications associated with obesity, and discuss ways to optimize care of the morbidly obese pregnant woman.
- Review the historical significance of IVF on multiple gestation rates, discuss the association of IVF with birth weight, congenital anomalies & neurodevelopment, and interpret the impact of single embryo transfer on IVF outcomes.
- Define the three levels of clinical evidence, explain appropriate interpretations of scientific articles, and present four examples of anecdotal vs. evidence-based conclusions.
- Define the current practice of aneuploidy diagnosis & screening, review indications for use of cell free fetal DNA, and discuss the appropriate use & limitations for noninvasive prenatal diagnosis.
- Review the history of screening for cervical cancer & cancer precursors, discuss the changes in screening for cervical cancer, and describe the new consensus guidelines & management of abnormal screening tests.
- Identify the barriers to care for women & their children in the developing world, list the major causes of maternal & infant mortality in the developing world, and explain current advances & programs aimed at decreasing maternal & infant mortality.
- Review diagnostic concepts in subfertile patients, discuss the implications of uterine anomalies in subfertility, and evaluate treatment protocols for challenging cases.

## Accreditation

Application for CME credit has been filed with the Academy of Family Physicians. **Determination of credit is pending.**
