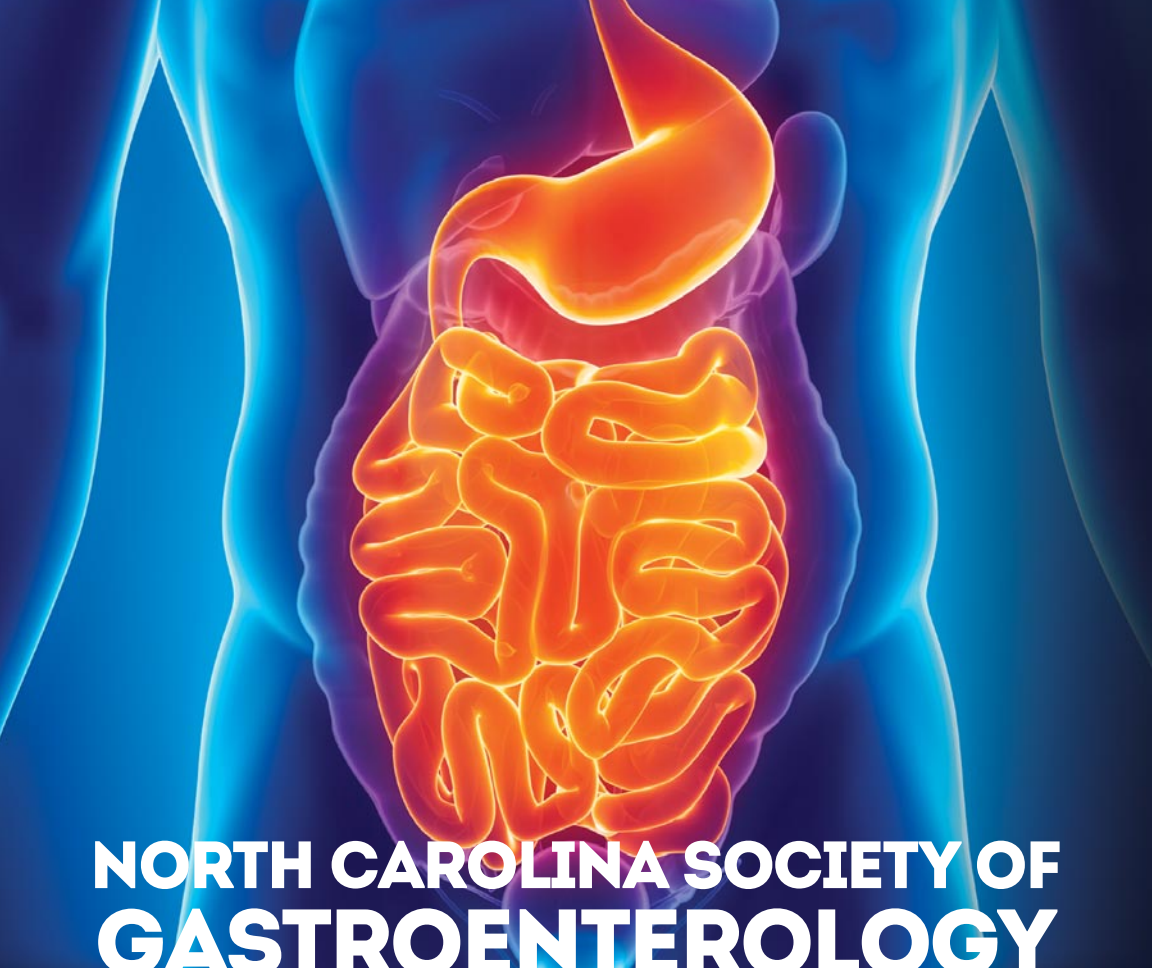

Program Description

The purpose of this educational activity is to review current thinking with respect to pathophysiology, management, and outcomes of common gastrointestinal diseases. The program will consist of lectures and panel discussions from the experts in the field of Gastroenterology and Hepatology.

Target Audience

Physicians in Gastroenterology and Hepatology, Physician Assistants, Nurse Anesthetists and Nurses working specifically in gastroenterology.

Objectives

At the conclusion of this program, participants should be able to:

- Evaluate current myths related to treatment of diverticulosis and diverticulitis.
- Review current evidence based practice guidelines for diverticulosis and diverticulitis.
- Trace the course of treatment for small polyps and adenomas to include early detection and the natural history of the disease.
- Discuss the new Multi-Society Task Force Colorectal Polyp Surveillance Guidelines and evidence supporting them.
- Review the most recent treatment developments in hepatitis C virus (HCV) and the impact on current management.
- Discuss benefits of decreasing modifiable risks and practicing advanced diagnostic treatment modalities in the management of non-alcoholic fatty liver disease (NAFLD).
- Discuss current diagnostic, screening and therapy recommendations for hepatocellular carcinoma.
- Review the impending changes in gastroenterology delivery systems to include accountable care, clinical integration of informatics, reimbursement changes and bundled payment processes.
- Discuss quality and cost efficiency measures for gastroenterology.
- Discuss the current state of bariatric surgery including demographics, updated procedures, diabetes mechanisms, and endoluminal treatments.
- Recognize the efficiency and qualitative role of endoscopy in the management of the bariatric patient.
- Define narcotic bowel syndrome in relation to prevalence, etiology and current diagnosis and treatment.
- Utilize recently published data to explain narcotic detoxification in narcotic bowel syndrome.
- Review the pathophysiology, screening test, and treatment modalities in relation to diagnoses and management of chronic nausea.
- Review the importance of quality, efficiency and value measurement in GI endoscopy.
- Identify key operational metrics of endoscopy unit efficiency.
