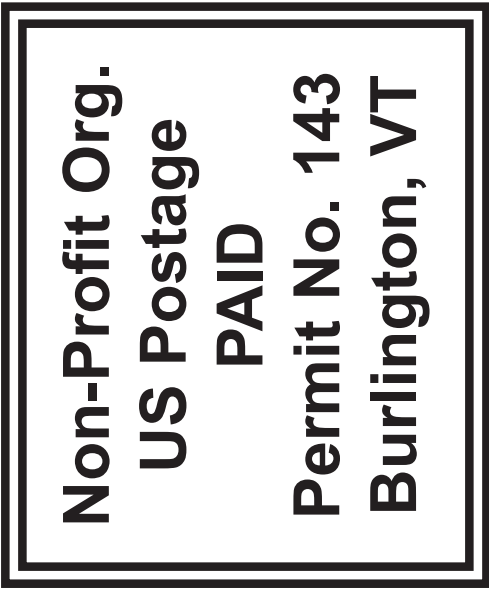
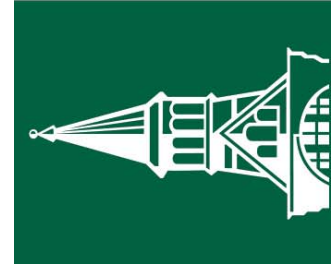

COURSE DESCRIPTION

The course will provide practical approaches to common problems in hospital medicine informed by experts and the latest evidence.

TARGET AUDIENCE

The target audience is comprised of physicians, physician assistants, nurse practitioners, and nurses practicing hospital medicine. Some of the clinicians will also be engaged in education, research, quality improvement, and management. The audience may also include hospital medicine program administrators, resident physicians, and medical students with an interest in careers in hospital medicine.

- To select the appropriate diagnostic tools and therapies for managing healthcare-associated pneumonia
- To effectively evaluate a patient with elevated Troponin I

This Hands-on Ultrasound Skills Workshop is designed to introduce participants to bedside ultrasound techniques and clinical applications. The course will provide basic instruction and scanning experience of several organ systems. Each station will include introductory slides and a faculty to attendee ratio of 1:4 or less.

REGISTRATION AND CANCELLATION

Tuition: Register by **January 10, 2014** and pay tuition of \$395 Physicians; \$295 Nurses, Physician Assistants and other health professionals; and \$195 for residents and fellows. Fee includes course materials, continental breakfast each morning, afternoon refreshments and a welcome reception.
