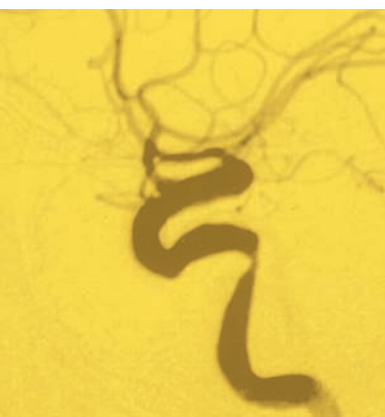

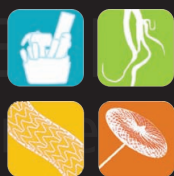

General Information

Introduction

SCAI 2014 Scientific Sessions will deliver the Best of the Best in Interventional and Invasive Cardiology Education to interventional and invasive cardiologists, fellows-in-training, other cardiovascular physicians, cath lab nurses, technologists, and staff. With an emphasis on nurturing an intimate, interactive, case-based atmosphere for learning, this program will provide a dynamic mix of case reviews, cutting edge presentations, review of recent trials, focused, interactive workshops and symposia, as well as the presentation of data from late-breaking clinical trials and abstracts. All will be presented by an international faculty of the biggest names in the field demonstrating state-of-the-art practice of interventional therapies.

SCAI 2014 will be organized into the following tracks: general, quality improvement, coronary, peripheral, structural and congenital. In addition to structured mini-symposia focusing on transradial interventions, CTO, CLI, TAVR and more, the program features programs designed for early-career interventionalists as well as hemodynamics and imaging symposia. Two entertaining evening functions will provide an opportunity for social interaction and networking among participants and faculty, including a Presidents' Reception on Wednesday, May 28 and the Annual Reception on Friday, May 30. Satellite symposia will be conducted at various times throughout the conference. Continuing highlights of the program are the **Founders' Lecture**, the **Hildner Lecture**, the **Mullins Lecture**, and **C3 SUMMIT®** for fellows-in-training.

Educational Objectives

The **SCAI 2014 Scientific Sessions** learning objectives are:

- Provide an overview of the latest science, challenges and opportunities within the field of interventional cardiology;
- Discuss the safety and efficacy of newly developed devices and therapies in order to improve early and late procedural outcomes after coronary interventions;
- Recognize the appropriate diagnostic studies for evaluation of acute coronary syndromes and review new approaches to non-surgical management;
- Emphasize the importance of implementing quality-based practices including appropriate use criteria, consistent documentation and assignment of quality champions;
