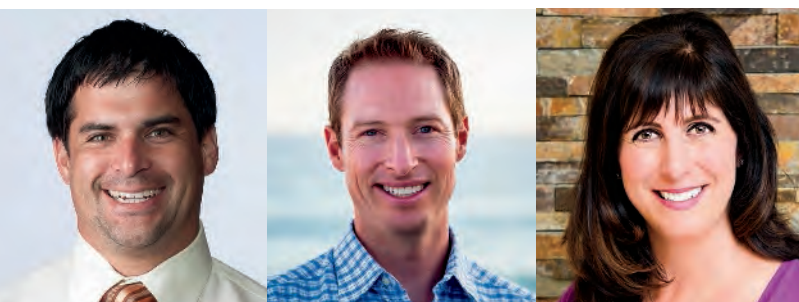
Advanced Integrative Cardiology
