INTERNATIONAL SYMPOSIUM

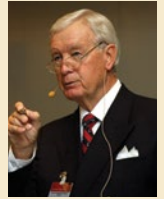

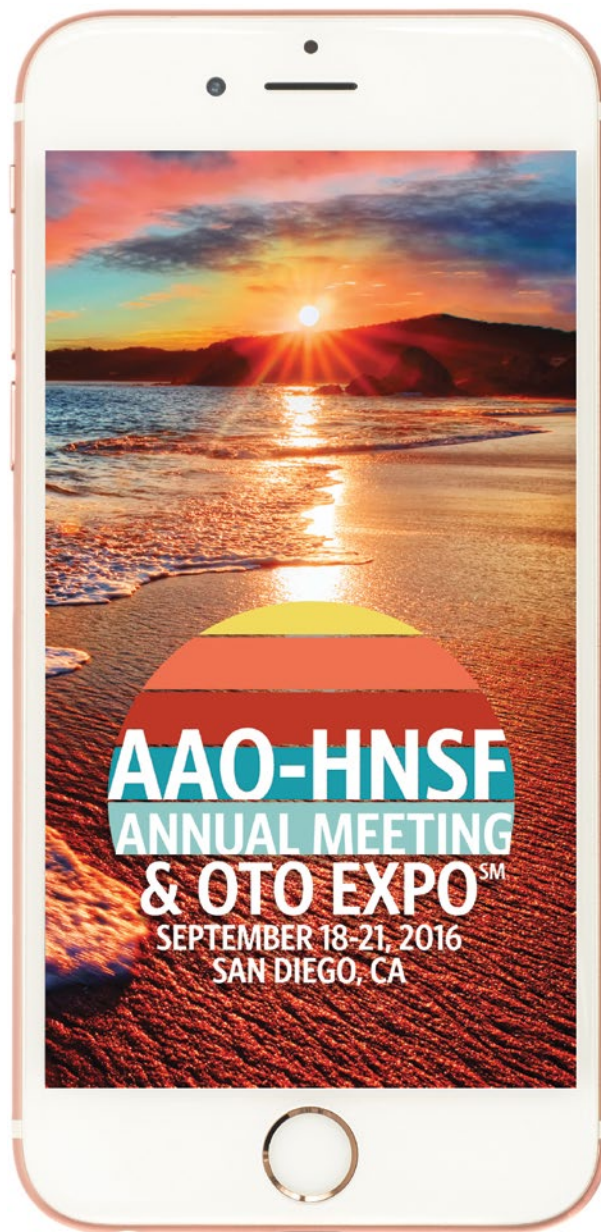

AAO-HNS/F HANDS-ON SALIVARY ENDOSCOPY COURSE

This one-day course will address current advances in minimally-invasive salivary gland surgery. The morning will feature didactic lectures by leaders in this cutting-edge field. Following lunch, attendees will be given the opportunity to practice these surgical techniques on cadavers with expert feedback. This course will be beneficial for otolaryngologists, head and neck surgeons, oral-maxillofacial surgeons, and related physician assistants and nurse practitioners.

DETERMINE the indications for sialendoscopy and salivary duct surgery versus submandibular or parotid gland resection

INCREASE knowledge and comfort level with procedures including punctal dilation, ductal dilation, sialendoscope insertion and maneuvering, sialendoscopic-guided instrument use (snare, graspers, drills, lasers, dilators), sialothiotomy, sialodochotomy, sialodochoplasty, and transfacial extractions

ACS ULTRASOUND COURSE: THYROID AND PARATHYROID ULTRASOUND SKILLS-ORIENTED COURSE *

Saturday, September 17 ♦ 8:00 am – 4:30 pm ♦ Lisa A. Orloff, MD, and Russell B. Smith, MD, Course Directors

The goal of this course is to introduce the practicing surgeon to office-based ultrasound examination of the thyroid and parathyroid glands. The distinction of normal from malignant lymphadenopathy is emphasized with a demonstration of the comprehensive examination of lymph node basins in cervical zones I-VI.

The process of ultrasound guided fine-needle aspiration (FNA) of thyroid nodules and enlarged lymph nodes is demonstrated in didactic lecture format. Other conditions which may mimic thyroid pathology or are relevant to an understanding of cervical ultrasound will also be illustrated. In addition, skill sessions allow the surgeon to learn varied techniques of FNA of lesions in phantom models.

Patient volunteers with thyroid and parathyroid pathology and lymphadenopathy will allow supervised hands-on experience with transverse and longitudinal ultrasound methods. Attendees will be instructed in the practical details and hurdles in developing office-based ultrasound.
