



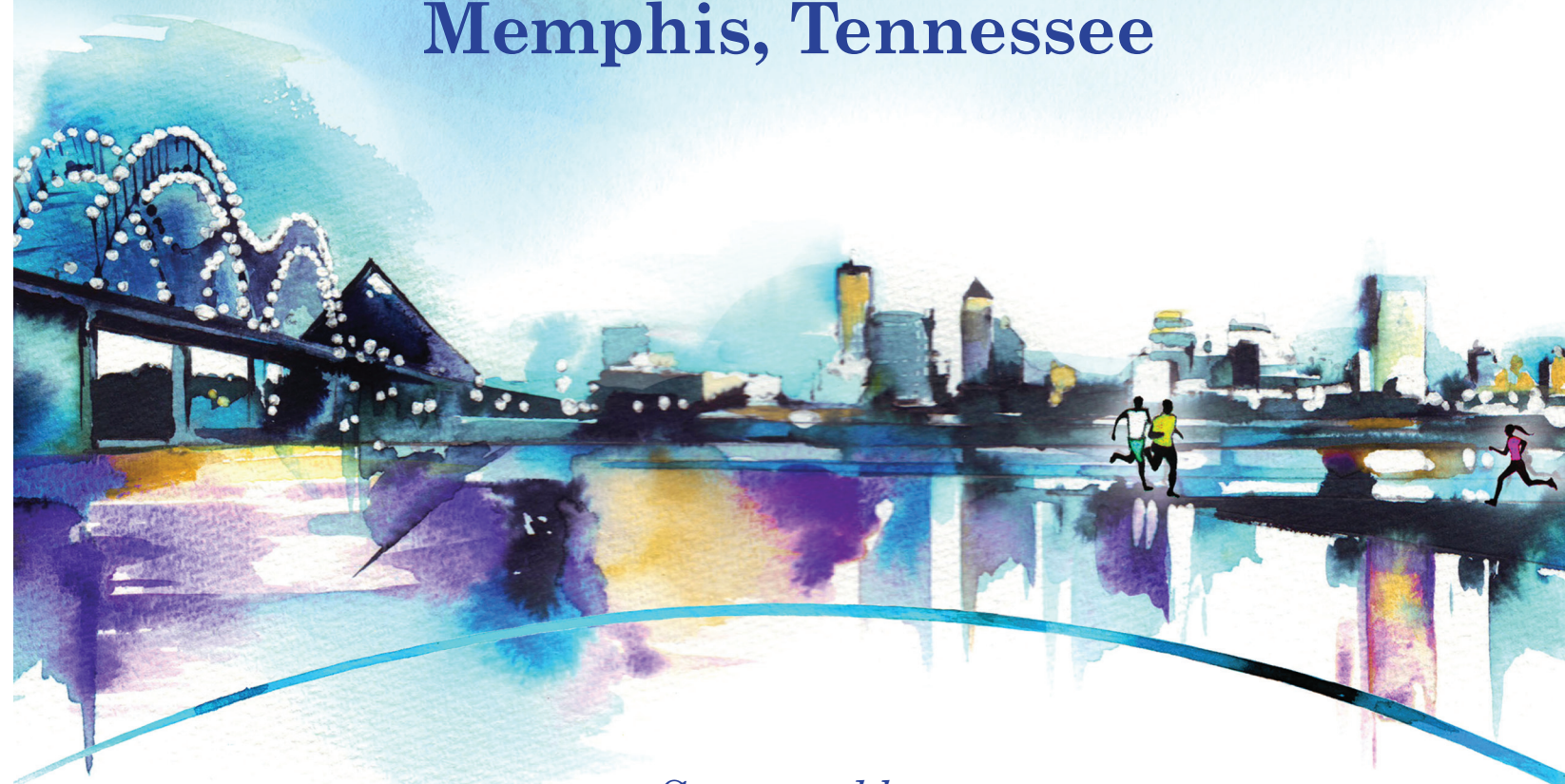

The Primary Care Issues in Women’s Health conference is designed as an update and review on issues specifically related to the management of women’s health.
