



The Lodge at Whitefish Lake Inspired by the grand lodges of the past and surrounded by mountains with the pristine waters of Whitefish Lake at it's backdoor. The Lodge is only minutes from downtown galleries and shops of Whitefish and less than a 30-minute drive to the scenic wonders of Glacier National Park. The Lodge offers all the amenities of a full-service resort including complimentary valet parking and shuttle service to boat and personal watercraft rentals, a private beach, and relaxing spa treatments.
