The Center for Physician Resilience

Wayne M. Sotile, PhD is the founder of The Center for Physician Resilience in Davidson, North Carolina. As an international thought leader on physician behavior and burnout, he consults widely with medical group practices and health care systems, teaching evidence-based strategies for deepening collaboration and collegiality, and promoting physician engagement and resilience while coping with change. He is published widely in the peer-reviewed medical literature and has authored or co-authored nine books, including *The Resilient Physician* (2002) and *Building Resilience in Neurosurgery Residents: A Primer* (2015).

Dr. Sotile has delivered more than 9,000 invited addresses and workshops to medical audiences, including invited presentations to the American Medical Association Leadership Conference, the International Conference on Physician Wellness, the American Academy of Medical Administrators, and numerous meetings of medical specialty societies and hospital communities.

Dr. Sotile earned a BS degree in psychology from Louisiana State University and a PhD in clinical psychology from the University of South Carolina. He completed his clinical training in medical psychology in the Department of Psychiatry at Duke University Medical Center.

EDUCATIONAL NEEDS & OBJECTIVES AND CME ACCREDITATION

Educational Needs

The President-Elect of the SCSAUA (Dr. Brian J. Flynn), consulted with SCSAUA Executive Committee members, including the current SCSAUA President, Dr. Jeffrey M. Holzbeierlein; SCSAUA Past President, Dr. Damara Kaplan; SCSAUA Secretary, Dr. James Cummings; SCSAUA Treasurer, Dr. Timothy D. Langford; and Chair, Office of Education of the AUA, Dr. Victor Nitti, regarding the needs we are attempting to fulfill through our annual scientific program. It was agreed by the above committee members, Section Officers, and Director of the Office of Education of the AUA that there continues to be significant educational needs for our Annual Meeting and scientific program.

Novel treatment strategies for prostate cancer remain of interest to almost all urologists. As there are now several new options for treatment, it is critical that the audience understand the options and the indications for these treatments. This will be reviewed in state-of-the-art lectures on prostate cancer.

Multiple post-conference surveys have indicated a desire for greater pediatric and transitional urology presentations; however, finding a topic that is of interest to all urologists can be challenging. In this year's session, we will review the management of the transitional urology patient. This has importance for all urologists as they accept pediatric patients into their adult practices. As these patients mature, they are likely to see these scenarios.

Guidelines remain a critical component of our teaching and message to all urologists. An update on the newest guidelines as well as other urology guideline updates will be presented during the meeting.

The resurgence of classic procedures for female SUI and prolapse is of interest to urologists as they look to the past for new alternatives. It is critical that urologists have a thorough understanding of the classic procedures and contemporary procedures for SUI and prolapse.

One of the fastest growing areas of urology surgery is MIS (laparoscopic and robotic). There will be two sessions on MIS for both benign and malignant GU conditions. The lecture will address the indications for MIS with emphasis on technique.

Panel discussion on procedure selection for BPH will be provided. This will be of great interest for those who perform BPH surgery.

A lecture and panel discussion will be held on endourology and stone disease, a topic suggested from last year's survey. This will be of great use to urologists that utilize ureteroscopy and percutaneous nephrolithotomy.

Perhaps one of the areas of greatest importance is what changes in healthcare mean for the practicing physician. An update on this and what the future holds will be presented and will be of great interest to all SCS members.
