KEYNOTE SPEAKER



Michael Miloro, DDS, MD, FACS

Dr. Michael Miloro is Professor and Head of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery at the University of Illinois at Chicago College of Dentistry. He attended college at the University of Rochester earning a B.S. degree in Neuroscience. He attended dental school at Tufts University in Boston, and medical school and residency training in General Surgery, and Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery at the University of Pennsylvania in Philadelphia. Dr. Miloro has held academic positions at The Ohio State University, University of Maryland, and University of Nebraska. Dr. Miloro is a Diplomate and past-Examiner for the American Board of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery, a Faculty Fellow of the American Association of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons, a Fellow of the International Association of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons, and a Fellow of the American College of Surgeons.

Dr. Miloro has major clinical and research interests in orthognathic surgery, TMJ surgery, implant surgery, and trigeminal nerve injuries and reconstruction. Dr. Miloro has lectured nationally and internationally, has published extensively in the medical and dental literature with over 150 peer-reviewed publications. Dr. Miloro currently serves as the Section Editor of the Journal of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery and is Editor of three major textbooks including Peterson's Principles of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery, Complications in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery, and Trigeminal Nerve Injuries.

1. Zygomatic Implants: Friend or Foe? 60 minutes

Severe maxillary atrophy presents a clinical challenge for implant reconstruction and may require extensive hard and soft tissue grafting to create sufficient bone for dental implant placement. Zygomatic implants offer an alternative treatment option that avoids additional procedures, costs, and morbidity, with immediate placement of a maxillary interim prosthesis.

2. Who Needs Patient-Specific Implants for Orthognathics? 30 minutes

With the current trend towards increased reliance on technology for planning and performing orthognathic surgery, we must question whether the additional costs are warranted and if the personalized medicine results in improved patient outcomes. Custom plates are not indicated for all orthognathic procedures but may be useful in certain clinical scenarios.

3. How Can We Augment Esthetic Orthognathic Outcomes? 30 minutes

The goals of orthognathic surgery include improvement in function, esthetics, and airway, when indicated. When the esthetic changes are inherent in the orthognathic procedures, there are several enhancement procedures that can be utilized simultaneously to further improve the esthetic outcomes.

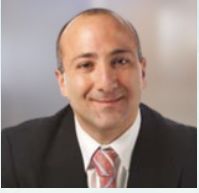
4. How Should We Treat Facial Asymmetries? 30 minutes

Facial asymmetries represent a complex clinical scenario that may require a variety of surgical procedures including orthognathic surgery, TMJ surgery with alloplastic replacement, and hard and soft tissue reduction or augmentation procedures.

5. TMJ Replacement: The Good, The Bad, and The Ugly? 60 minutes

Alloplastic TMJ replacement has been shown to result in predictable functional, esthetic, and airway outcomes in children and adults with minimal morbidity. There are a variety of indications for total joint replacement with or without concomitant orthognathic surgery. Although uncommon, complications from total joint replacement may occur.

Elie M. Ferneini, DMD, MD, MHS, MBA, FACS, FACD

Dr. Ferneini is a practicing Oral and Maxillofacial surgeon in Cheshire Connecticut. He is an associate clinical professor at the University of Connecticut and Frank H Netter School of Medicine at Quinnipiac University. He has a long history of conducting research resulting in over 135 scientific publications and book chapters. He has lectured nationally and internationally. He is currently the Editor in Chief of the American Journal of Cosmetic Surgery. Dr. Ferneini is a co-editor of nine textbooks on all aspects of oral and maxillofacial surgery.

Defending the Specialty: Collaborative Patient Safety Principles

Through an analysis of closed OMSNIC medical professional liability claims , this course will provide strategies and resources to reduce risk in the oral and maxillofacial surgery practice and improve defensibility in oral surgery related professional liability claims. Closed claim topics will include alveolar surgery, implants and those procedures involving advanced anesthesia. Risk management topics include documentation, communication, informed consent, and patient selection. There are no prerequisites.

Course Objectives:

- *Identify common medical professional liability risks specific to oral and maxillofacial surgeons.*
- *Formulate policies and procedures to assist in improving patient safety and the defensibility of a potential claim.*
- *Relate communication and documentation strategies to support patient safety.*
- *Discuss current and emerging trends related to risk management in the oral and maxillofacial surgery specialty.*
