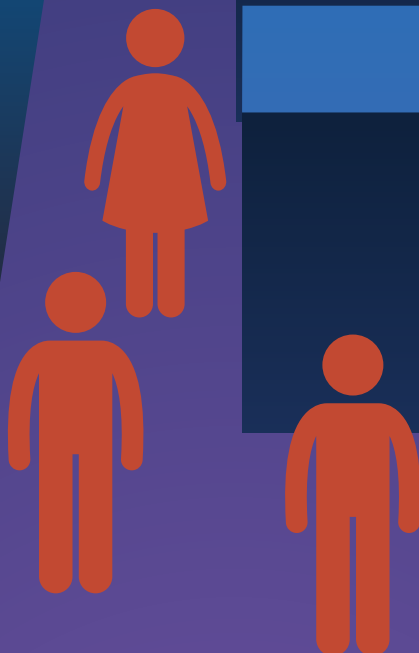

ENDOFEST® 2016 HIGHLIGHTS

EndoFest has been completely reformatted to meet the needs of our participants. Note the following changes:

- All full conference registrants will now have the option of including two hands-on sessions with their registration, or they may choose a didactic-only program.
- None of the sessions will run concurrently, so that all participants can enjoy the full program.
