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Description

The conference format includes didactic lectures and case presentations held each morning; there is ample time for discussion and audience participation.

Getting to Aspen/Snowmass

Aspen-Pitkin County Airport/Sardy Field (ASE) is approximately 7 miles from Snowmass Village and 4 miles from the Aspen business district. The airport is served by United Airlines and American Airlines regional jets.
