	Principles and Techniques of Non Pharmacologic Behavior Guidance — David Tesini Barriers to providing comprehensive Dental Care for children often originate in the provider’s ability to manage the behavior. This is especially true for patients with Special Health Care Needs. The same skills that allow us to successfully treat any child, without sedation or general anesthesia, can form the basis of your management techniques for CSHCN. The participant will learn how to sort out the important phenotypic characteristics of the “Autism Perspective” and see how misconceptions of the diagnosis can lead to failed behavior management approaches in the dental office. Participants will learn how to implement the D-Termined Program into their office and how this can, not only reduce OR visits but can enable providers to successfully complete comprehensive treatment plans.

	Dr. Wright currently serves as interim chairman of the Department of Endodontics at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill School of Dentistry. He is a professor in the Department of Pediatric Dentistry, and is a former chairman of the department. Dr. Wright completed his D.D.S. degree from West Virginia University and went on to pursue his pediatric dentistry residency and a National Institute of Health Postdoctoral Fellowship in Caries Research at the University of Alabama in Birmingham, prior to joining the faculty at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. Dr. Wright has authored more than 100 publications and his research focuses on the diagnosis and treatment of developmental defects in teeth resulting from hereditary and environmental condition as well as and understanding normal tooth development. Dr. Wright has served as chair for the American Dental Association’s and the American Academy of Pediatric Dentistry’s Council on Scientific Affairs and maintains an active private practice that includes providing care to patients with special medical and dental health care needs.
	David A. Tesini D.M.D., M.S. has been District 1 Trustee at American Academy Of Pediatric Dentistry since May 26, 2013 Mr. Tesini is an associate clinical professor at Tufts and has taught in both the General Practice Residency Program and the Post Graduate Pediatric Dentistry Department. He serves as the associate chief dentist of the Tufts Dental Facilities for Patients with Special Needs, he developed community dental outreach models to assure dental preventive dental care during the closings of the Massachusetts institutions. He has served on several councils and committees at the state and national dental society level, most notably as chairman of the Massachusetts Council on Dental Health and Health Planning and as Vice Chairman of the Standards and Survey Committee of the JCAHO. He served on the AAPD Council of Continuing Education and the AAPD Committee for CSHCN. He was the founder and president of Project Stretch: Dentistry Reaching out to Children, which, since 1988 has provided free dental care to over 25,000 impoverished children abroad. He has lectured numerous times at Tufts, Yankee Dental and ADA Meetings and completed a teaching sabbatical at the University of Pavia Orthodontic Department in Pavia, Italy. He received a Fellowship in Dental Surgery from the Royal College of Surgeons, Edinburgh, Scotland, and in 2011 he received the AAPD Manny Album award for his longstanding activities in Special Patient Care. Tesini is in private practice in Sudbury, Mass. He completed a three-year residency fellowship in pediatric dentistry at the Tufts New England Medical Center Boston Floating Hospital. He graduated from Tufts Uniresidency fellowship in pediatric dentistry at the Tufts New England Medical Center Boston Floating Hospital. He graduated from Tufts University School of Dental Medicine where he received both his D.M.D. and M.S. degrees.
	Dr. Erin T. Shope, DMD, MS is the director of interdisciplinary care in the Department of Pediatric Dentistry at the Eastman Institute for Oral Health at the University of Rochester Medical Center. She is a full time assistant professor of clinical dentistry in the Department of Pediatric Dentistry. Dr. Shope has served as the pediatric dentist with the Golisano Children’s Hospital’s Pediatric Cleft and Craniofacial Center since 2012. A large portion of her practice involves treating patients with craniofacial differences and includes a special focus on pre-surgical infant orthopedics. Dr. Shope is actively involved in the American Cleft Palate-Craniofacial Association and has chaired the pediatric dentistry discipline forum at the ACPA Annual Meeting for multiple years. Dr. Shope has lectured internationally on craniofacial care, providing education to craniofacial teams in Toulouse France and Montreal Canada, and completing a visiting professorship at Jagiellonian University in Krakow, Poland.
