INVITED GUEST SPEAKERS



Prof Peter Choong (Australia)

Prof. Peter Choong is the Sir Hugh Devine Chair of Surgery, and Head of Department of Surgery University of Melbourne at St. Vincent's hospital Melbourne. Peter is also the Director of Orthopaedics at St. Vincent's Hospital Melbourne, and Chair

of the Bone and Soft Tissue Sarcoma Service at the Peter MacCallum Cancer Centre. Peter is the immediate past President of the Australian Orthopaedic Association.

Peter has served continuously on a committee or Board of the AOA since 1996 and has held the roles of Chair of the Victorian Board of Studies, Chair of the Federal Training Committee, Scientific Secretary, RACS Chair of The Board of Orthopaedics, RACS Chair of the Victorian State Committee, Chair of the Victorian Orthopaedic Trust Scientific Advisory Group and current Chair of the research Committee of the AOA. He was then recent Chair of the Musculoskeletal Clinician Leadership Group which is an advisory group to the Victorian DHHS and the Minister of Health. At St. Vincent's Prof Choong has also been the Programme Director of Surgery and Chief Medical Officer.

Prof. Choong's research which has been supported by recurrent grant funding (NHMRC, ARC, RACS, AOA, Cancer Australia) focuses on 3 areas, that underpin his clinical programmes, namely improving outcomes of arthritis surgery, studying the treatment of bone tumours and advanced limb reconstruction. Prof Choong is widely published with over 360 peer-reviewed articles (H score 64) in these areas.

He has been awarded the John Mitchell Crouch Fellowship (2008) which is the most prestigious research

award made by the Royal Australasian College of Surgeons to a Fellow who in the opinion of the College Council, is making an outstanding contribution to the advancement of surgery, or to fundamental scientific research in the field.

Peter has also been awarded the Ivins Visiting Professorship (2003) and the Coventry Visiting Professorship (2014) from the Mayo Clinic. These represent the two most prestigious awards in Orthopaedics at the Mayo Clinic. In 2015, Prof. Choong was awarded the AOA Research Excellence award, the St. Vincent's Health Australia Excellence award and the City of Melbourne Award.

PAEDIATRICS



Dr Tom Novacheck (USA)

Dr. Novacheck is a pediatric orthopaedic surgeon who specializes in treating cerebral palsy and other complex orthopaedic conditions in children and adolescents with an emphasis on hip reconstruction.

Dr. Novacheck completed his medical degree at the University of Wisconsin-Madison (1985), his orthopaedic residency at Pennsylvania State University (1990), and his pediatric orthopaedic fellowship at Newington Children's Hospital in Connecticut (1991). He has been in practice at Gillette Children's since 1991.

Dr. Novacheck's research has been focused primarily on outcomes studies of management of gait disorders in individuals with cerebral palsy and development of motion analysis testing methods and reporting procedures.





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Educational activities for residents, fellows, and health care professionals are focused primarily on normal and pathological gait, particularly cerebral palsy.

He has been a member of the teaching faculty of the annual international gait analysis course since 1991.



Prof Allan Wang (Australia)

Allan Wang is a Shoulder Elbow surgeon in Perth, Australia practising from Sir Charles Gairdner Hospital and St John of God Private Hospital. Allan is a Clinical Professor in Orthopaedic Surgery at the University of Western Australia.

Current clinical interests include computer navigation in total shoulder arthroplasty, and accelerated rehabilitation to optimise clinical outcomes. Allan also combines his clinical interest in rotator cuff injury with research studies on autologous tendon cell treatments and collagen scaffolds to enhance healing after surgery.

After orthopaedic training, Allan completed clinical fellowships in Adelaide and the United States. Allan was an RACS research fellow and subsequently completed a PhD. He continues to collaborate with basic science researchers and also enjoys supervising registrars, post graduate research students and an accredited Fellowship in Shoulder Upper Limb surgery.

Currently Allan is President of the Shoulder Elbow Society of Australia. He has served the AOA on national committees, including Chair of Continuing Orthopaedic Education, and AOA Scientific Secretary and Board Director (2012-2015).



Professor Ian A Trail (UK)

Ian has been a Consultant at Wrightington Hospital for nearly 30 years and is currently the 'Senior Clinician and Head of Service'.

He qualified from the University of Manchester Medical School in 1978, thereafter receiving training in the North West, Europe and the United States, the latter as a Clinical Fellowship at the Mayo Clinic. He was appointed as a Consultant at Wrightington Hospital in 1991.

Formerly, Professor Trail also operated at the Royal Manchester Children's Hospital for almost 20 years. He is also a Senior Lecturer at the University of Manchester

and Professor at Edge Hill University. He has also served as President of the British Society for Surgery of the Hand and Treasurer of the British Orthopaedic Association. In addition, he has served as Editor of the Shoulder and Elbow Journal.

Since 1989 he has published over 120 research papers and has delivered numerous national and international presentations. He has been Guest Lecturer at the American, Australian, South African, Indian and European Societies for Surgery of the Hand and Shoulder meetings. Currently he has authored four books of surgery to the hand, elbow and shoulder.

In addition to this, he has also been involved in the development of several new joint replacements used widely in shoulder, elbow and hand surgery. He has also helped to develop a number of new operations and new systems for treating injuries to the hand and wrist, including fractures.

OPENING SPEAKER



Jonathan Broomberg (CEO of Discovery Health)

Dr Jonathan Broomberg is CEO of Discovery Health, South Africa's largest health insurer.

Jonathan is a medical doctor and health economist. He studied medicine at the University of the Witwatersrand, South Africa, and then read PPE at Balliol College as a Rhodes Scholar. He subsequently completed MSc and PHD degrees in Health Economics at the University of London.

Jonathan's career in healthcare includes a period serving as Special Advisor to the Minister of Health of South Africa in the first post apartheid administration. Prior to joining Discovery Health 10 years ago, Jonathan was a founding director of a private equity and venture capital business investing in healthcare and education.

Alongside his private sector interests, Jonathan maintains a strong engagement with South African and global health policy affairs, and served for 5 years on the Technical Review Panel of the Global Fund against AIDS, TB and Malaria, including 2 years as Chair of the Panel.





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VISITING PRESIDENTS



William Maloney
American Academy AAOS -
past President

Dr. Maloney is Boswell Professor and Chairman of the Department of Orthopaedic Surgery at Stanford University School of Medicine. He has served on numerous AAOS committees, including the Council on Education. Previously, he was chair of the American Joint Replacement Registry Board of Directors (AJRR), and on the board of directors for the Knee Society, the Hip Society, the Western Orthopaedic Association, and the American Association of Hip and Knee Surgeons (AAHKS). Dr. Maloney is a past president of the Hip Society.

Dr. Maloney attended undergraduate school at Stanford University and received a medical degree from Columbia College of Physicians and Surgeons in New York City. He interned and then served as junior, senior and chief resident in orthopaedic surgery at Stanford Medical Center, and was a clinical fellow in hip reconstruction surgery at Massachusetts General Hospital in Boston. Prior to becoming Orthopaedic Chair at Stanford, Dr. Maloney served on the faculty of the Department of Orthopaedic Surgery at Washington University School of Medicine and as Chief of Orthopaedics at Barnes-Jewish Hospital in St. Louis, Mo.



Rick Wright
American Orthopaedic Association

Dr. Wright is the Jerome J. Gilden Distinguished Professor of Orthopaedic Surgery and Executive Vice Chairman for the Department of Orthopaedic Surgery at Washington University Medical School in St. Louis, Missouri. He completed his undergraduate and medical education at the University of Missouri – Columbia. He did residency at Vanderbilt University Hospital, and was a fellow in sports medicine at the Minneapolis Sports Medicine Center.

Dr. Wright currently serves on the Board of Directors for the American Board of Orthopaedic Surgery and is First President-Elect for the American Orthopaedic Association. He is a founding member of the MOON Research Group and the Principle Investigator for the MARS (Multi-center ACL Revision Study) Research Group.

Dr. Wright is the recipient of numerous research awards - the Cabaud Memorial Award, Neer Research Award, Kappa Delta Ann Donner Vaughn Award, O'Donoghue Clinical Research Award, Jerome J. Gilden Distinguished Physician Award, Palma Chironis Award for Excellence in Teaching, and the Lee T. Ford MD Award for Academic Achievement; author of over 200 scientific papers, one book and sixteen book chapters.



Lawrence Malisano
Australian Orthopaedic Association

Lawrence Malisano is a Senior Orthopaedic Specialist at the Royal Brisbane and Women's Hospital, Brisbane, affiliated with the University of Queensland Medical School, has been faculty on National and International Courses, and involved in research and implant development. Lawrence is the current President of the Australian Orthopaedic Association, and until recently has been the Royal Australasian College of Surgeons Chair of Professional Standards.



Ananda Nanu
British Orthopaedic Association

Mr Nanu was appointed a consultant at Sunderland with the brief of dealing with the pelvic and acetabular fracture cases for the North of England. In a relatively safe traffic environment, this amounted to between 50-55 cases a year, which required him to increase his volumes of primary and revision hips and knees to fill allocated lists.

He has been Chairman of the AO principles and Advances courses in the UK, and International faculty across the world for trauma.

He was elected to the BOA council in 2013 and to the Presidential line in 2016. He is the 100 th President of the BOA and in its centenary year has great pleasure in inviting you all to the Congress in Birmingham, September 25-27.





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John Antoniou
Canadian Orthopaedic Association

Dr. John Antoniou is an orthopaedic surgeon at the Jewish General Hospital (Montreal) and the Research Director of the Orthopaedic Research Laboratory at the Lady Davis Institute. He is a full tenured Professor of Surgery and Research Director of the Division of Orthopaedic Surgery of McGill University's residency program (Montreal).

Dr. Antoniou specializes in adult joint reconstruction and alternative treatments for patients suffering from osteoarthritis. During his orthopaedic residency training, he pursued a PhD in Experimental Surgery with focusing on the biochemistry and molecular biology of the musculoskeletal system.

He completed the Canadian Royal College and US board certifications in orthopaedic surgery along with three fellowships in shoulder, hip and knee reconstruction. He is a Fellow of the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada since 1997, a Fellow Member of the American Association of Hip and Knee Surgeons and an active member of Hip Society.

Dr. Antoniou's research focuses on the clinical and basic science investigation of aging and degeneration of the musculoskeletal system. He is the first orthopaedic surgeon to receive the "Chercheur National" award of the Fonds de Recherche du Québec - Santé (FRQS). His clinical interests include the evaluation and management of adult hip and knee reconstruction issues while his fundamental research uncovered biological repair strategies for degenerating intervertebral discs and cartilage with particular interest on peptides with growth factor-like properties, scaffolds and mesenchymal stem cells therapies.

Recently he discovered that the N-terminal peptide of the link protein that stabilizes the proteoglycan aggregates has unique biological properties for the cartilage and intervertebral disc tissue repair. His research and arthroplasty fellowship programs have attracted an increasing number of graduate students and fellows worldwide and his work has won several prestigious awards such as Berton Rahn Prize Award in 2010 (Switzerland), Best NASS 2013 Paper and winner of the AmorChem Knock-Out™ event in 2015.

Dr. Antoniou was invited to present his work in over 200 international conferences, workshops symposiums and courses, and over 500 abstracts were presented at national and international meetings in the United States, Japan, England, Australia, New Zealand, Brazil, Greece, Belgium, Israel, and China. He published and co-authored over 170 original articles in peer-reviewed journals such as Journal of Clinical investigation, Arthritis Research and Therapy, Tissue Engineering, Spine, Biomaterials, Arthritis & Rheumatism, Journal of Bone and Joint Surgery and Journal of arthroplasty.

Dr. Antoniou has recently served as the president of the Canadian Orthopaedic Research Society. He is the co-chair of the ORS's International Combined Orthopaedic Research Society committee since 2013 and in June 2018 he will begin serving as the COA's President for the year 2018-2019. He is a selected scientific reviewer for journals, conferences, and grant task forces and serves on several editorial boards.



Richard Street
New Zealand Orthopaedic Association

Richard Street is an Orthopaedic Surgeon who practices in public and private in Auckland. His public hospital practice is at Middlemore. He specialises in lower limb disorders in paediatric and adult patients.

He is President of the New Zealand Orthopaedic Association.

He managed the Middlemore Orthopaedic Department for six years and is still involved in department administration.

He previously served a seven year term as President of the New Zealand Foot and Ankle Society.

For many years, he has been involved in New Zealand Orthopaedic Association's dealings with the Accident Compensation Corporation, previously chairing this committee, and has helped form constructive relationships with ACC, helping to guide their strategies. He has also been involved in many national orthopaedic department reviews and credentialing processes, and was instrumental in starting the Ministry of Health Enhanced Recovery After Surgery process. He also has an interest in health planning, economics and process.





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Pradeep Makan

South African Orthopaedic Association

Pradeep Makan is an Orthopaedic Spinal Surgeon in private practice in Cape Town where he developed his passion for the management of degenerative spinal conditions including complex adult spinal deformities. He completed his under and postgraduate training at the University of Cape Town. After completing a spinal fellowship in Oxford in 1996, he returned to Cape Town to deliver a spinal service at Groote Schuur Hospital. He was a Smith and Nephew traveling Fellow in 1994 and an ABC Fellow in 2002.

He is President of SA Orthopaedic Association, Past President of SA Spine Society, member of NASS, AO Spine and The Girdlestone Society, an examiner of the College of Orthopaedic Surgeons of SA and a reviewer for international and local journals. He is married to a family physician, Juanita, and has twin daughters. He is a keen hiker and a wine collector.

SOUTH AFRICA – GENERAL INFORMATION

LOCATION

Situated at the southern tip of the African continent, South Africa has a land area of 1,3 million square km (500,000 square miles), five times the size of Great Britain and greater than California, Nevada, Utah and Arizona combined. This impressive stretch of land runs from the great Limpopo River in the north, down to the Cape of Good Hope and Cape Agulhas on the southernmost coast - a distance of nearly 2 000 km (1 240 miles).

South Africa has common boundaries with the Republics of Namibia, Botswana and Zimbabwe, while the Republic of Mozambique and the Kingdom of Swaziland lie to the northeast. Isolated 1 920 km southeast of Cape Town in the Atlantic, lie Prince Edward and Marion Islands. Completely enclosed by South African territory in the southeast is the mountain kingdom of Lesotho. South Africa's climate runs from temperate to sub-tropical, its land-scapes range from stark deserts and spectacular mountains to lush grasslands and forests, and its cultural diversity can be found in rural subsistence communities or in cities as sophisticated and cosmopolitan as anywhere in the world.

WILDLIFE

South Africa is known for its abundant wildlife as well as its fantastic birding and eco-tourism possibilities. However, the real heart of this vibrant country is the diversity of people and cultures. South Africa's family tree goes way back to the start of time.

Culture. Home to approximately 45 million people of various races and ancestry. The South African diverse cultures consist of the Nguni people (including the Zulu, Xhosa and Swazi) who account for two-thirds of the population; the Sotho-Tswana people (who include the southern, northern and western Sotho; the Tsonga; the Venda; Afrikaners (of Dutch origin); English; Coloureds; Indians ;Khoi and San people.

CURRENCY

The monetary unit is the South African Rand.

LANGUAGE

The official language of the Congress will be English and there will be no translations.

DRINKING WATER

Water from the taps is perfectly safe to drink in all the cities, towns and game reserves.

ELECTRICITY

220/230 volts AC.

TIME

South Africa is UT+2 (2 hours ahead of GMT – Greenwich Mean Time).

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS & HEALTH

A valid passport is required. Passport holders of more than 80 countries, including the USA, Canada, Japan and the EU, can visit without visas. Contact your nearest SA Tourism office or South African Consulate for an updated list. Visitors arriving from a yellow fever zone require a valid international yellow fever inoculation certificate (Infants under the age of one are exempt).

CLIMATE

Seasons are opposite to those of the northern hemisphere. Warm, sunny and temperate conditions are typical of South Africa, making it a popular destination for sunshine-seekers.

VAT

Value Added Tax (VAT) AT 15% is included in the price of most goods and services. Visitors are required to pay VAT but VAT refunds can be claimed at airports, harbours and customs offices on items taken out of the country when the total value exceeds R250.

Pre-advised dietary requests have been catered for.
