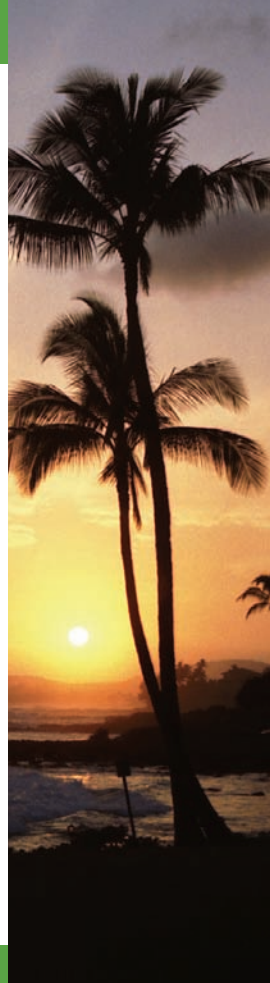
Target Audience
