

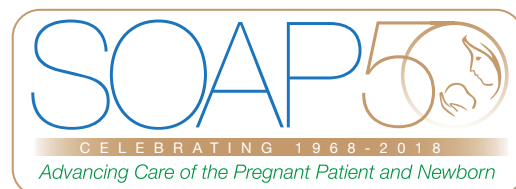

On behalf of the SOAP Board of Directors and the SOAP 2018 Annual Meeting Program Committee, we are excited to welcome you to SOAP's 50th Annual Meeting! The meeting will be held at the Loews Miami Beach on May 9-13th, 2018.

The theme of the meeting will be Obstetric Anesthesia: Past, Present, and Future. Sessions honoring SOAP's past will include this year's Gertie Marx Education Lecture, which will be given by Bradley Smith, MD and Richard Clark, MD, two of the six founders of SOAP. Given the ongoing national opioid crisis, special sessions will be dedicated to understanding and addressing the opioid epidemic. Dr. Jerome Adams, the first physician-anesthesiologist to serve as Surgeon General, will speak on the opioid epidemic on Friday afternoon.* And several sessions will be devoted towards the future of obstetric anesthesia and obstetric anesthesia patient safety. All of the workshops and conference events will occur on site at the Loews.

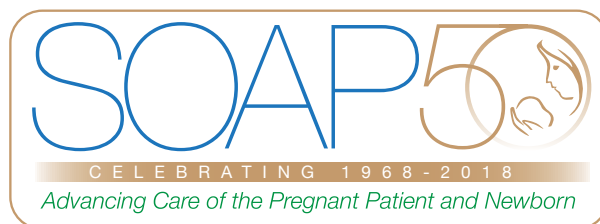
This year's meeting will begin with a day of pre-meeting workshops. These workshops will include both hands-on skill development, such as the workshops on improving point-of-care ultrasound skills (e.g. transversus abdominis plane blockade, gastric ultrasound, transthoracic echocardiograms), as well as faculty development workshops for practicing anesthesiologists (innovations in medical education and managing difficult conversations). The Research Committee will hold a half-day symposium on the opioid epidemic, taking a deep dive into what research has been done, and what research is needed. The Spanish-language SOAP 4th Latin American Symposium will include speakers from the US and Latin America, focusing on issues critical to care in Latin America. In addition, there will be a Chinese Symposium, focusing on obstetric anesthesia issues.

Many of your favorite sessions will return, including the Gertie Marx Research Competition, Best Paper Sessions and the year's complete obstetric anesthesia related literature review (the Gerard W. Ostheimer Lecture).

New this year is a Saturday clinician track, filled with the most requested refresher course lectures for the practicing and occasional obstetric anesthesia clinicians on Saturday. The Clinician Track includes eight 30-minute lectures as well as the main session keynote lectures that day. Please come and bring your friends and colleagues. Enjoy the benefits of knowledge, employing the latest techniques and protocols to improve patient outcomes and sharing information with your colleagues.

There is an exceptional slate of distinguished speakers at this meeting. This year's "What's New in Obstetrics" will be delivered by Sean Blackwell, M.D., President of the Society for Maternal Fetal Medicine. SOAP is comprised of anesthesiologists, obstetricians, pediatricians, and basic scientists who share an interest in the care of the pregnant patient and the newborn.

The mission of this Society is to improve the pregnancy-related outcomes of women and neonates through the support of obstetric anesthesiology research, the provision of education to its members, other providers, and pregnant women, and the promotion of excellence in clinical anesthetic care.

A membership in SOAP is an opportunity to meet people who share your interests, and to stimulate improvements in health care for pregnant patients.

3. Integrate new developments in the fields of obstetrics and neonatology to enhance interdisciplinary communication and management of parturients and their babies.
4. Develop ERAS protocols to optimize anesthetic and post-delivery medications to reduce narcotic consumption, earlier mobilization and earlier discharges.
5. Express the elements of critical care medicine used in obstetric anesthesia that may improve maternal outcomes.

Session Descriptions

Oral and Poster Sessions

Oral Presentations

Oral presentations of high quality peer-reviewed scientific research related to obstetric anesthesia, followed by a question and answer session.

Poster Sessions

These are poster reviews. Designated moderators will moderate poster presentations of peer-reviewed scientific research.

General Sessions

Best Case Report Review

The best case reports will be reviewed, presenting the audience with the most unusual, significant cases that have widespread interest and clinical pearls.

Best Paper Session

Presentation of obstetric anesthesia research judged by peers as the best quality research currently taking place, moderated by Dr. Lawrence Tsen. A question and answer period will be included. This is a judged competition.

Best Poster Session

The best research posters not being presented orally will be reviewed, presenting the audience with the best research, the significant findings, and clinical applicability.

Fred Hehre Lecture

This keynote lecture, in memory of Fred Hehre, is a senior, experienced perspective on key issues in obstetric anesthesia. The 2018 Fred Hehre Lecture will be given by Dr. Robert Dyer.

Future of Obstetric Anesthesia 2028 Panel

This session will focus on the future of obstetric anesthesia and the educational tools that will be necessary. Panelists will differentiate patient wearables and their utility for patient centric labor analgesia and analyze potential disruptive technologies that will change clinical practice in 2028.

Gerard W. Ostheimer Lecture - What's New in Obstetric Anesthesia?

Always a highlight of the meeting, the Gerard W. Ostheimer lecture is a review of important, relevant, and/or practice-changing literature related to obstetric anesthesia, obstetrics, perinatology, and allied medical disciplines that was published in calendar year 2017. This year's Ostheimer lecturer will be Dr. Ashraf Habib. This presentation will bring you up to date on the latest evidence-based advances in the anesthetic management of pregnant women.

Gertie Marx Education Lecture: SOAP's 50th Anniversary

Obstetric anesthesia past, present and future. Learn from two of the original founders of SOAP (Drs. Smith and Clark) about the remarkable history of obstetric anesthesia – SOAP's first 50 years. SOAP President Dr. Carvalho will speak about SOAP today and the SOAP Centers of Excellence. SOAP President-Elect Dr. Zakowski will forecast the future of obstetric anesthesia and SOAP's next 50 years. In honor of SOAP's 50th Anniversary, a special video commemorating Gertie Marx will be shown.

Gertie Marx Research Competition

In memory of Gertie Marx, this session is a presentation of obstetric anesthesia research judged by peers as the best quality research done by medical students, residents, and fellows. This is a judged competition, moderated by Dr. Cynthia Wong.

Innovations for Obstetric Hemorrhage

Essential for patient safety or a costly distraction? Panelists will consider innovations for obstetric hemorrhage, including blood loss quantification, viscoelastic monitors and compression balloons.

Maternal Cardiac Disease Panel

Update on the latest trends, techniques and technology for use in the peri-delivery care of the parturient with cardiac problems.

Obstetric Critical Care: Finally Understanding the Clotting Cascade and DIC

This session will discuss the causes of DIC emergencies during pregnancy and how to write the "bedside" clotting cascade to guide urgent patient care. Participants will be able to better evaluate and implement appropriate therapy for pregnant patients in DIC.

Obstetric Healthcare Disparities

This session will explore racial/ethnic disparities in obstetric anesthesia, possible contributing factors, and potential strategies for reducing disparities.

Opioid Epidemic

The national opioid epidemic also affects pregnant women and their newborns. The prevalence severity of opioid tolerance/addiction in pregnant women their neonates and how obstetric anesthesia providers can help will be discussed.

Pro/Con Debate: Obstetric Patients Need Respiratory Monitoring After Neuraxial Morphine

This debate will frame the arguments for minimal or intensive perioperative respiratory monitoring following cesarean delivery with neuraxial opioids. The usual 'no holds barred' rules for Pro-Con debates apply.

Research Hour - Opioids in Pregnancy and the Postpartum: New Insights from Research

Updates on the epidemiology of opioid use during pregnancy, the good, the bad, and the ugly; how to safely treat acute and chronic pain during pregnancy; how to provide safe and effective anesthesia for delivery in women with opioid use disorder or treated with chronic opioid therapy; future directions to fill in the gaps in knowledge.

Shared Decision Making

Participants will learn how shared decision-making with patients can improve outcomes, and strategies for managing challenging conversations. Dr Pian-Smith will also review strategies to facilitate shared decision-making in an interdisciplinary team, even during fast-paced clinical challenges.

The Future of Health Care Policy

Over the last few decades, the federal government has taken an increasing role in health care policy, insurance, regulation, and payments. Congressman Andy Harris M.D., member of the House Committee on Appropriations, will address the future of healthcare policy and how those changes may impact our patient care.

Patient Safety in Obstetric Anesthesia: Where Are We Now and What's in the Future?

Patient safety is a universal priority across the healthcare system. Dr. Birnbach is an obstetric anesthesiologist who is a leader in patient safety and a member of the Anesthesia Patient Safety Foundation Board of Directors. This lecture will cover best safety practices for obstetric anesthesiologists and discuss the future of obstetric patient safety.

Session Descriptions

Vasopressors: Ephedrine vs. Phenylephrine vs. Norepinephrine

Three obstetric anesthesiologists will discuss/debate the indications, benefits and risks of three vasopressors (ephedrine, phenylephrine and norepinephrine) when used to maintain maternal hemodynamic stability during anesthesia and analgesia. Each presenter will discuss one of the medications, then there will be time for discussion/debate and questions from moderator and the audience.

Venous Thromboembolism and Obstetric Anesthesia Guidelines

Dr. Lisa Leffert will relate the impact of the new venous thromboembolism thromboprophylaxis guidelines to the management of obstetric patients and utilize tools to make decisions regarding neuraxial anesthesia.

What's New in Maternal Fetal Medicine

Sean Blackwell, M.D., President of the Society for Maternal Fetal Medicine (SMFM), will discuss recently published and ongoing clinical research studies that impact obstetrical practice as it related to obstetric anesthesia care. He will also review new practice guidelines from SMFM as they relate to obstetric anesthesia care.

What's New in Neonatology: 50 Years of Progress in Neonatal Respiratory Care

In this presentation, Dr. Bancalari will review the evolution of neonatal respiratory care over the last 50 years. He will describe some of the interventions that have resulted in much improved outcomes, but also the challenges associated with the increased survival of extreme premature infants.

Clinical Track

Anticoagulation and Regional Anesthesia: Guideline Review

The widely known ASRA guidelines for neuraxial anesthesia in anticoagulated patients do not specifically address the unique needs of pregnant women. This lecture will discuss the current guidelines for performing neuraxial analgesia and anesthesia in pregnant women receiving thromboprophylaxis or anticoagulation, based on the recently released SOAP Consensus Statement.

Enhanced Recovery After Surgery (ERAS) Cesarean

Enhanced recovery programs (ERAS) after cesarean deliveries are increasingly popular and part of the Perioperative Surgical Home (PSH). Learn to fast track cesarean recovery with team based coordinated care efforts include improved surgical preparation, pain management and recovery efforts. Pertinent steps and information will be presented in this lecture.

Nitrous Oxide for Labor Analgesia

This session will review the history, efficacy, and side effects of using nitrous oxide for labor and delivery. In addition, it will provide information regarding protocols for implementing inhaled nitrous oxide as an option for labor analgesia.

Practice Management: Obstetric Anesthesia

Participants will review the definition of quality and the facets of quality metrics. The latter half of the presentation will focus on the creation of future quality measures, specifically as it pertains to the consequences of measures and the challenges of data capture.

Preeclampsia Update

During this session, we will review the latest information on the etiology and progressive course of preeclampsia. The newest update on terminology, obstetric and anesthetic management will also be presented.

The Baby Friendly Initiative - Coming Soon to Your L&D Unit

The "Baby-Friendly Hospital Initiative" (BFHI) has been advocated as model of care that encourages and supports breastfeeding and other aspects of optimal early infant care. Presented by Dr. Camann, this session will discuss the history of the BFHI, current efforts to implement this program, as well as a variety of controversial features of this program.

Updates on the Prevention and Management of Postpartum Hemorrhage

The main objectives of this presentation are to highlight the epidemiology of postpartum hemorrhage (PPH) and hemorrhage-related morbidity, and to analyze findings from recent studies describing pharmacologic and non-pharmacologic approaches for the prevention and treatment of PPH.

Vasopressors: What's New

In the past decade, phenylephrine has supplanted ephedrine as the drug of choice for prevention and treatment of hypotension during neuraxial anesthesia for cesarean delivery. Recently, several studies have looked at whether norepinephrine might be an even better choice, and examined the doses required. In this presentation, we will discuss the evidence and indications and potential clinical strategies for the various vasopressors used in obstetric anesthesia.

Lunch Discussion Table: Why is it Important to Implement an ERAS Program for your Cesarean Section Patients?

Over lunch, participants will discuss the necessary requirements for implementing an ERAS protocol for cesarean section, the various elements of ERAS components that are applicable to cesarean section patient and the benefits achieved from implementing an ERAS protocol for cesarean section.

Lunch Discussion Table: Overcoming Obstacles to Patient Safety on Labor and Delivery

This session will address obstacles to implementing patient safety initiatives for the obstetric anesthesia provider. Attendees should expect an interactive, PBLD and case-based session with ample time for discussion of personal and individual safety goals and challenges with session faculty and other participants. Current literature regarding these topics will be highlighted.

Lunch Discussion Table: Critical Care Scenarios: Improving Obstetric Outcomes

Participants will discuss critical care simulation scenarios representing leading causes of maternal death and tips for optimal diagnosis and management of these scenarios using lung and cardiac ultrasonography.
