President's Letter

Dear Utah State Orthopedic Society:

As a Board, there have been times over the past decade when we have wondered about the purpose of the Society. We have wondered whether the effort involved in putting all this together was worth it. We have wondered whether we were making a difference.

This recent legislative session has reemphasized to us the importance of what we do. We received notice about the podiatry bill with its initial proposed expansion of scope of practice at the end of one week, and by the middle of the next week it was already being brought up for vote in a subcommittee. In its original form, it would have directly affected many members of the Society, and more importantly, it had the potential to harm Utah citizens by legally allowing podiatrists to do things far up the leg outside their training. Because our Society existed, we could respond rapidly and, while the compromise bill we ended up with isn't perfect, it is far better at defining podiatry in the state of Utah.

Without the Utah State Orthopedic Society, this would not have been possible.

In the past year, we have also responded to legal advertisements against our members trolling for cases; we have gone back to Washington DC on our annual trip to talk to the Congressmen there about our issues (*and through the efforts of many people over the years, SGR is finally repealed*); and we have worked on our annual meeting.

Which brings up the main point of this letter: *If at all possible, please consider attending this year's meeting.* We realize that everyone is busy. We all have busy medical practices, personal obligations, and outside interests. However, our Society is only as strong as its members, and only when we come together. This meeting is our main way we raise enough limited funds to be able to have a lobbyist, etc. It makes it so we can function. And most importantly, it helps provide one day a year when we can gather to renew the friendships and ties that keep us together, so when the next crisis comes, we can respond to that from a position of strength.

So, if you are a regular attendee to the USOS annual meeting – we thank you. If it's been a while, please consider joining us. Thanks...
