Course Description

This educational program is hosted by the Divisions of Gastroenterology at Harbor-UCLA Medical Center, Torrance Memorial Medical Center (TMMC) and California Pacific Medical Center (CPMC). Live demonstrations from Harbor-UCLA and CPMC are transmitted to the auditorium via the internet. The course is focused on in-depth understanding of new interventional endoscopic techniques and their applications. Lectures and live demonstrations will be performed by our expert faculty. Instant communication with the procedure operators will be possible through audio visual networks.

Course Objectives

The objectives of the symposium are to educate physicians, GI fellows, nurses and allied health professionals on diagnosis and management alternatives for complex gastrointestinal pathology. Patient selection, indications for intervention, advanced endoscopic and surgical options and future device developments will be presented. At the conclusion of this activity, participants will be able to:

- Describe the latest advances in endoscopic imaging of the GI tract
- Identify alternatives to the conventional surgical approach
- Choose the most appropriate treatment
- Explain the advantages and disadvantages of advanced endoscopic techniques
