The 2019 Southern Pediatric Endocrine Society annual meeting is designed to allow members of the Society, other interested pediatric endocrinologists and healthcare professionals to present new research findings and interesting case studies of pediatric endocrine problems in order to update participants on the diagnosis and treatment of endocrine abnormalities. Topics were selected to meet the educational needs of pediatric endocrine providers to improve knowledge, competence, and patient outcomes. Opportunity will be provided for discussion, questions and answers and interaction among participants in an informal setting.

Target Audience

The course is designed for pediatric endocrinologists, pediatric endocrine nurses, diabetic educators, PA's, fellows and other healthcare professionals interested in pediatric endocrinology.
