#7266 Physical Therapy Neurological Examination for an Ankle Foot Orthosis

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SUMMARY: There is a paucity of research justifying the practice and evidence of the physical therapist's role in recommending an ankle foot orthosis (AFO). The comprehensive examination should be person-centered and collaborative in nature with the orthotist, but is often absent in rehabilitation practice. This course reviews components of a physical therapy examination for an AFO as presented in the literature and provides evidence of what should be included, deleted or modified based on the person's impairments, social determinants of health *and* the presenter's experiences in AFO fabrication. The course addresses functional mobility skills related to gait and considers social determinants of health in a person-centered manner so that skills learned can be immediately applied to examine the foot and ankle for orthotic intervention in acute care, inpatient/outpatient rehab or home health.

Course methods include: lecture, photographic/video presentation, group discussion, knowledge assessment, and question/answers.

PRESENTER: Jennifaye V. Brown, PT, MSPT, PhD, NCS, CAPS has a BA-Psychology (Emory University), a MS-Physical Therapy (University of Miami-FL) and a PhD-Exercise Science (University of South Carolina). Jennifaye V. Brown, PT, MSPT, PhD, NCS, CAPS has over 35 years of clinical experience focused in neurorehabilitation across the continuum of care and has presented numerous continuing education courses on adult neurologic assessment and treatment intervention for acquired brain injury, particularly stroke. Dr. Brown developed a special interest in using 3D laser scanning & printing to design and fabricate AFOs that accommodate ladies' footwear based on neuromuscular and gait impairments. Her primary research explored the perceptions of individuals with stroke regarding their experiences with AFO fabrication, modification and maintenance and how the AFO impacts walking and participation in life roles, resulting in the book, *Brace Yourself - Everything You Need to Know About AFOs After Stroke*. She is a NDT-trained therapist with six additional courses taken after the NDT (Bobath) Three Week Course on Treatment of Adult Hemiplegia. As an Advanced Credentialed Clinical Instructor by the Clinical Instructor Education Board and a four-time 10-year term board certified neurologic clinical specialist by the American Board of Physical Therapy Specialties (ABPTS) of the APTA, Dr. Brown has taught at six PT and two PTA programs. She is a Certified Aging in Place Specialist and member of the APTA, Neurology Section of the APTA, SC Chapter of the APTA, Athletics & Fitness Association of America, and a graduate of the prestigious APTA Fellowship in Education Leadership. Her current interests are in stroke prevention and post-stroke fitness using aquatic fitness as a mechanism for exercise and physical activity.

OBJECTIVES: Upon completion of this course, the participant will be able to:

1. Formulate the components comprising a patient-focused examination for an AFO based on research evidence presented
2. Evaluate objective findings of the examination (including outcome measures) to prioritize impairments qualifying the need for an AFO
3. Interpret the results of the subjective and objective examination portions including outcome measures to recommend an AFO based on a case study
4. Integrate information learned to justify examination components or outcome measures which can be immediately applied to neurologic rehabilitation practice.

FORMAT: This is a 3-hour course equivalent to 3 CEU's or 0.3 CEUs offered as a live webinar or self-study. Instructors present the live course content via an internet website displaying real time power points. Learners will receive a course instruction link.
