SUMMARY: This course is designed to be an introduction to the Contemporary Neuro-Developmental Treatment (NDT) clinical practice model and its application to pediatric therapy with a focus on communication and feeding. NDT is an interdisciplinary, dynamic, hands-on, problem solving approach used in the treatment of children and adults with neurological pathophysiological impairments. Intervention involves direct handling to optimize function in the areas of swallowing, speech production, and voice.

Participants will learn how positioning of the body relates to the function of the mouth, as well as simple strategies to facilitate improvement of speech and language functional outcomes. Course instruction method includes: lecture, video clips, movement practicum, demonstration, videos, group discussion, lab practice, and question/answers.

PRESENTER: Patsy Tate, MS,CCC-SLP, C/NDT is a pediatric speech-language pathologist and a pediatric NDT speech instructor. She earned her Masters of Science degree from the University of Texas in Dallas in 1997 and has over 25 years of clinical experience, serving children from birth to 18 years of age.
