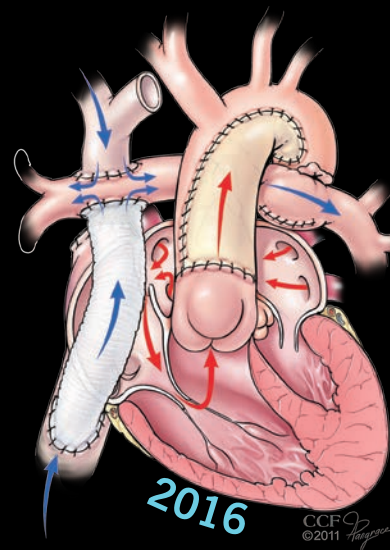

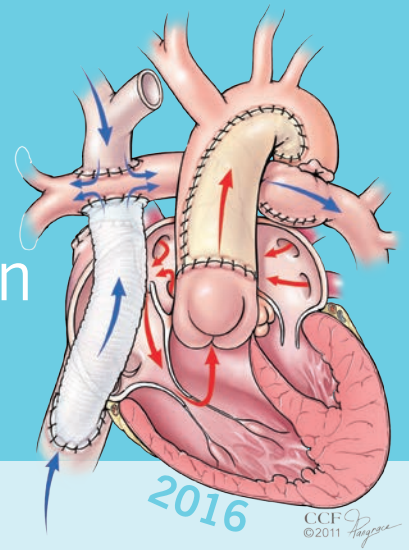

Overview

Medical and surgical guidelines for the identification and management of pediatric and adult patients with single ventricle anatomy. It has become increasingly difficult for clinicians to stay current with available options. The goal of these options is to improve patient outcomes that have an impact on quality of life. The format of this course is to provide multiple short lectures followed by vibrant panel discussions. Ample time will be allotted for participation by the audience with question and answer sessions.

Target Audience

The course is designed for physicians, fellows, residents and allied health professionals in pediatric and adult cardiology, cardiothoracic surgery, critical care medicine and pediatrics.

Objectives

1. Describe the possible neonatal interventions and their results.
2. Compare the surgical interventions to the long-term outcomes.
3. Describe why Fontan procedures fail, how to avoid failure with medical and surgical interventions.
4. Identify the alternatives to single ventricle being heart transplantation and assist devices, and the results of those interventions.

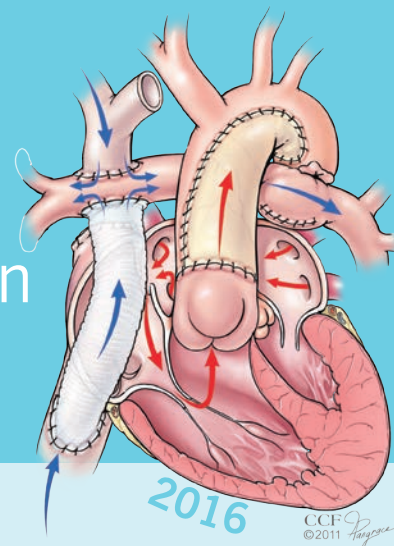

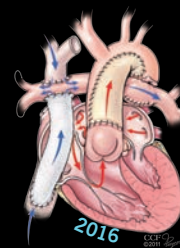

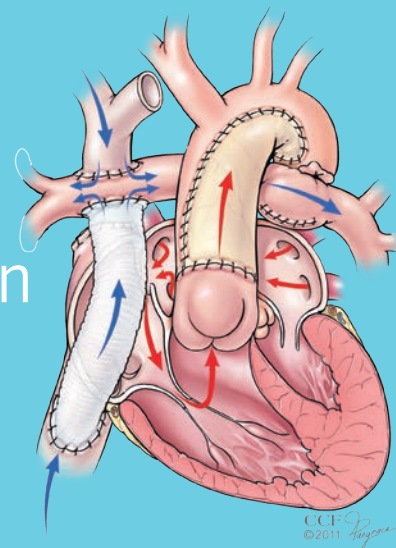
