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# Dear Friends and Colleagues,

In planning this year's meeting, we could think of no better venue than Vancouver for combining the stimulating scientific exchange and cordial social interaction that distinguish the ASOPRS Spring Symposium. It's an opportunity for members at all levels of experience to connect and forge lasting relationships.

Vancouver is an international, multicultural city in a beautiful natural setting, and ranks among the world's most desirable places to live or visit. It's a foreign destination (bring your passport), but is easily reached and has a very welcoming feel. The Fairmont Waterfront Hotel overlooks the harbor and the mountains beyond. It is directly opposite Canada Place, home of Vancouver's World Trade Centre, and the embarkation point for Alaskan cruises. The neighboring area is an upscale tourist venue, with shops, restaurants, and harbor-side biking and walking paths.

Rich Allen, Spring Meeting Program Chair, has crafted an outstanding program that combines original investigations, unique case reports, and complex reconstructive challenges. Functional, aesthetic and practice-management topics are well represented. A distinguished group of invited speakers will highlight the depth and breadth of talent in our Society. George Bartley, CEO of the American Board of Ophthalmology, will update the status of subspecialty recognition. Rob Mazzoli, the 2016 AAO Wendell Hughes Lecturer, will share advances in trauma management gleaned from military experience. ASOPRS members who are experts in their fields (and coincidentally represent our host country) will include Jean Carruthers on injectables, David Jordan on anophthalmic socket challenges and Peter Dolman on thyroid eye disease. Rob Fante, on behalf of OMIC, will address liability issues, and Jennifer Sivak-Callcott will discuss ergonomic concerns—each, in their way, occupational hazards for oculo-facial plastic surgeons.

Vancouver's attractions include the modern, efficient Skytrain that goes directly from the airport to within a block of the Fairmont Waterfront (no need to rent a car while in the city). Stanley Park, easily reached by foot or rental bike, spans nearly 1000 acres, and is ranked by *TripAdvisor* as the top urban park in the world. It boasts a 5-mile seawall with a multi-use trail for walking, jogging or biking, as well as the world-famous Vancouver Aquarium.

For those with extra days to spare, stunning attractions within 1–3 hours by rental car and/or ferry include Garibaldi Provincial Park in the Whistler area, Vancouver Island's natural Pacific Coast, and the famous Butchart Gardens of Victoria. Those with even more time might consider a “once-in-a-lifetime” Alaskan cruise.

I hope you can attend what will be another memorable Spring Meeting in the ASOPRS tradition.
