Conference Objectives

Increase knowledge of movement disorders in patients; use knowledge about sexuality in older adults to improve their sexual health; decrease the morbidity and mortality of geriatric patients with regard to COVID19; recognize common skin conditions in the elderly and be comfortable with management, including appropriate use of antimicrobials.
