ALOHA UPDATE: PEDIATRICS® 2017

- Describe the prevalence and risk factors for bullying and school violence and identify and provide intervention for the bully and bully-victim.
- Discuss pharmacologic and non-pharmacologic treatments for managing pain in children.

The overall learning need identified for this conference is for practical, evidence-based medicine that can be applied in the clinical setting.

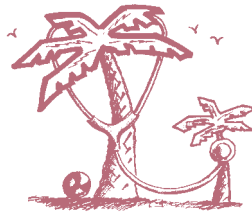
