- RN license in good standing with corresponding state nursing board
- 2 years of correctional nurse management experience; supervises other medical personnel and administrative staff
- Associate, Bachelor of Science (B.S.), Master of Science (M.S.) in Nursing or completion of an accredited nursing program

Continuing Education Opportunities

CONTINUING EDUCATION UNITS (CEUs)

ACA will offer continuing education units (CEUs). By completing educational and training programs, employees earn CEUs and the professional recognition that comes with them. Participants who register for the program earn 1.0 CEU from ACA for every one hour of program activities they attend. After the conference, ACA will send participants their certificates. A \$30 additional CEU registration fee is required to participate in this program. All workshops are accepted for CEU credit.



CERTIFICATION PROGRAM — Certified Corrections Professional (CCP)

FOR THOSE WISHING TO BECOME CERTIFIED, certification examinations are offered in the following areas:

- Certified Corrections Executive (Adult/Juvenile)
- Certified Corrections Manager (Adult/Juvenile)
- Certified Corrections Supervisor (Adult/Juvenile)
- Certified Corrections Officer (Adult/Juvenile)
- Correctional Behavioral Health Certification (Adult/Juvenile/Community Corrections)



There are also four certification categories for treatment staff:

- Certified Corrections Nurse/Manager (CCN/M)
- Certified Corrections Nurse (CCN)
- Health Services Administrator (HSA)
- Correctional Behavioral Health Certification (CBHC/Behavioral Specialty)



You need to have previously qualified — at least 30 days before the examination date — by submitting a completed application for certification obtainable online at www.aca.org or by sending a request for certification information to the professional development department at acaprodev@aca.org.

FOR THOSE ALREADY CERTIFIED — You can obtain continuing education credits toward fulfilling your recertification requirement by documenting your attendance at conference workshops — one recertification credit per hour of attendance.

Meet Your Continuing Education Requirements

Continuing Education Programs for Treatment Professionals

Target Population:

Physicians, psychologists, nurses, mental health professionals, correctional administrators, dentists, dental hygienists, treatment staff, security, educational staff, other corrections personnel and public health professionals who work with offenders.

Educational Objectives:

At the conclusion of this activity, the participants will be able to:

- Demonstrate competence in the limitations of correctional medicine concerning specific aspects of patient care.
- Determine those inmates/detainees who have a constitutional right to health care and at what level care must be provided.
- Choose between differing approaches to medical, mental health and substance use problems suffered by inmates.
- Establish coordination and cooperation between security and treatment personnel.

Physicians/Mid-level Providers:

The American Correctional Association is accredited by the Accreditation Council for Continuing Medical Education (ACCME) to provide continuing medical education for physicians. Physicians should only claim credit commensurate with the extent of their participation in the activity.

A \$99 additional CME fee is required to participate in this program.



Nurses:

ACA is an approved CE provider through the Florida Board of Nursing for continuing education contact hours for nurses (CE Provider # 50-8793). Nurses should only claim credit commensurate with the extent of their participation in the activity.

A \$30 additional CE fee is required to participate in this program.

Psychologists:

The American Correctional Association is approved by the American Psychological Association to sponsor continuing education for psychologists. 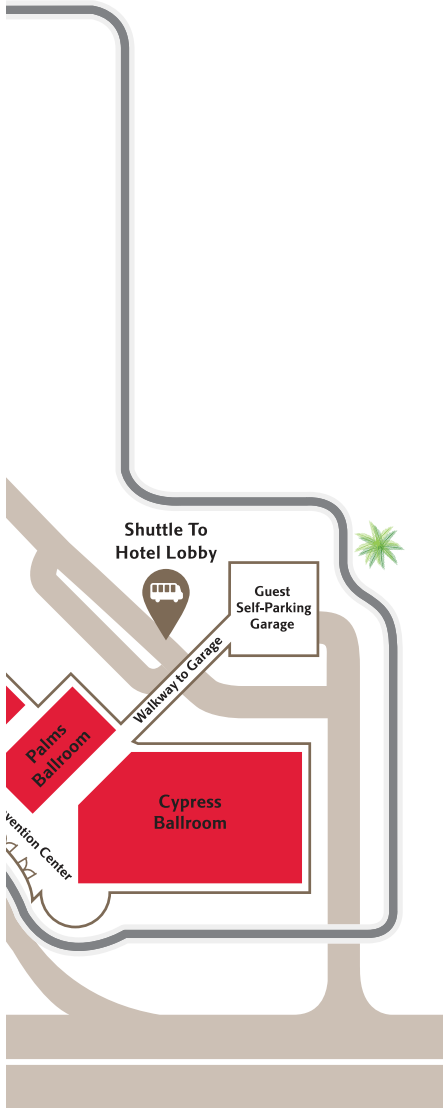

Professional Certification

Process

APPLY – Download Certification Application from aca.org, complete all sections, must include signatures from supervisors, current length of time in role and payment in order to be processed in a timely manner.

TEST – Obtain Proctor and select a date for the exam, proctors must be approved by the ACA. Exams are 4 hours and proctored, once complete, exams are sent to ACA office and the turn around is about 2-4 weeks. Scores of 70% and above=passing. 69% and below=failing, and candidates have an opportunity to retest (once) for free.

RECERTIFY – Once Certification is obtained, it remains current for 3 years, then candidates must recertify by completing an application, which includes personal information and documentation of activities outside of normal job scope over past 3 years (available in ReCertification Handbook, aca.org)

ACA's Leadership Development Program teaches participants to assess the challenging dynamics of their organizational culture and their role as leaders within it. The training can be customized to meet the needs of agencies.

BASIC LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT FOR THE CORRECTIONS PROFESSIONAL

This course includes forty (40) hours of instruction and is designed for new managers in a juvenile or adult correctional agency. The purpose of this course is to provide a management foundation, instill leadership skills, and improve the professional focus of participants to increase their agency's future leadership pool and provide professional growth.

ADVANCED LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT FOR THE CORRECTIONS PROFESSIONAL

This course includes eighty (80) hours of instruction and is designed for mid to upper-level managers in a juvenile or adult correctional agency.
