This training will satisfy the 4-hours Law and Ethics CPD mandate by addressing legislative and regulatory updates which impact professional practice, share ethics updates, utilize the Four-Bin Decision Making Model to work through moral and ethical dilemmas, and unpack ethical implications of integrating artificial intelligence (AI) into clinical practice.

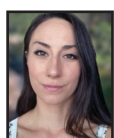

DIVERISTY INSTITUTE

Healing Through Layers: A Nervous System Approach to Generational Wounds

1:30 pm to 5:45 pm (4.0 CE Credits)

Level: Advanced

This training institute will explore and investigate the far-reaching impact of intergenerational trauma. Using a combination of examples from research studies and clinical experience, presenters will highlight the necessity for both recognizing generational trauma and educating patients on its effects. The workshop will examine intergenerational trauma's impact on the individual's psyche, the therapeutic dyad, and the patient's nervous system. The session will provide a rationale for using neuroscience concepts and techniques to achieve nervous system balance in patients navigating intergenerational trauma, as well as ways to highlight embedded healing pathways within clients' own cultural backgrounds. Presenters will name and demonstrate several tools and interventions that can be used in these approaches. Special attention will be paid to LGBTQIA+ and neurodivergent communities which can intersect with intergenerational trauma.



Harpreet Malla, PhD is a psychologist in private practice serving Los Angeles & Orange counties, and this year's CPA Division VII (Diversity & Social Justice) Chair. She has a passion for working with identity development as it pertains to queer and minority populations and specializes in couples navigating arranged marriages or other "nontraditional" relationship practices (poly, interracial, kinky) in her work. She has led corporate, collegiate, and community workshops to promote understanding through education, and has published academically.



Jaz Robbins, PsyD, BCHN is the 2025 President-elect of the Los Angeles County Psychological Association (LACPA). Dr. Jaz Robbins is a licensed psychologist and board-certified holistic nutritionist specializing in trauma-informed care and health psychology. She also provides training and consultation to hospitals and healthcare organizations that serve trauma patients. Dr. Robbins has expertise in the area of ethics and has served on the LACPA Ethics Committee since 2020. She is a published author and holds adjunct positions at Pepperdine University and University of Southern California.

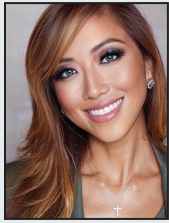

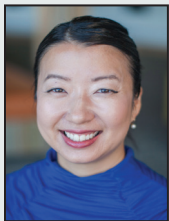
The New Psychology of Self-Leadership: Burnout Recovery, Inner Voice Repair, and the Science of Thriving

Level: Intermediate

This keynote explores how chronic burnout, emotional fatigue, and negative self-evaluations undermine clinicians' well-being and performance. Attendees will learn how to recognize signs of self-sabotage, understand the neuroscience of stress and cognitive overload, and apply evidence-based psychological tools to promote resilience, inner clarity, and sustainable self-leadership in both personal and professional domains.

Judy Ho, PhD, ABPP, ABPdN is a triple board-certified clinical and forensic neuropsychologist, tenured professor at Pepperdine University, and author of *Stop Self-Sabotage* and *The New Rules of Attachment*. She provides psychotherapy, neuropsychological evaluations, and expert witness services, and serves as consulting psychologist for the LA Clippers. A two-time NIMH award recipient, she integrates CBT, ACT, and DBT in her work and research. Dr. Ho is a sought-after media expert and keynote speaker and maintains an active research program to improve mental health care for high-need populations.

Expanding the Paradigm of Cure: What Is a Thriving Adulthood?

Level: Intermediate

Research on adverse childhood experiences (ACEs) has established a strong correlation between those who experienced more ACEs and an increased risk of adult physical and mental health problems. Trauma-based perspectives and treatments have helped clinicians and therapists shift from individual deficits, to asking about the experience of traumatic event(s). Utilizing recent data collected on a national sample of U.S. adopted adults, this keynote stimulates a dialogue on approaches to address the needs of people with histories of complex trauma, highlighting the need to have models of "cure" that include models of "healing" that help individuals make meaning of the events that happened to them and the relevance of post-traumatic growth for thriving adulthoods.

Hollee A. McGinnis, PhD is a prominent educator, scholar, and community organizer with almost 30 years of community organizing, practice, policy and research experience on adoption and global child welfare. Prior to her doctorate at Washington University in St. Louis, she was the Policy Director at the Donaldson Adoption Institute in New York City. She received her Master of Science from Columbia University School of Social Work, and a post-Master's Clinical Fellowship at the Yale Child Study Center. In 1996, she founded Also-Known-As, Inc., a non-profit adult intercountry adoptee organization in New York City.

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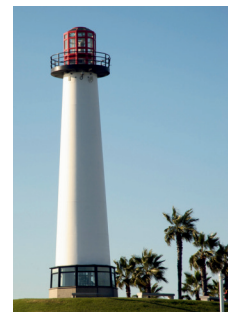
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
