Daneshvari R. Solanki, M.D.

Dr. Daneshvari R. Solanki graduated from Baroda Medical College in India. She completed her training in anesthesia at Sayajirao General Hospital and was awarded her medical degree in anesthesia. Soon after getting married, she and her husband moved to England where she started her residency training in anesthesia at Northwick Park Hospital in London. She completed her residency and after passing her examination received her diploma and became a Fellow of the Royal College of Anaesthetists (FRCA). She and her husband then moved to the United States. She completed one year of residency before being able to take her licensing examination. Dr. Solanki did her fourth year of residency in anesthesiology at the University of Wisconsin in Madison. They then moved to Texas and she started her career as an assistant professor in anesthesiology at the University of Texas Medical Branch (UTMB) in Galveston with Dr. James F. Arens, Chair of the Department of Anesthesiology. Dr. Arens later left and handed the reins over to Dr. Donald S. Prough, and Dr. Solanki is happy to say that she also enjoyed serving in that flourishing department.

Dr. Solanki enjoys teaching; and over the years, she gradually climbed the ladder to become a tenured professor in anesthesiology at UTMB. Along the way, she was given some teaching awards by the anesthesiology residents and was rewarded with the title of Laura Bragg McDaniel Distinguished Professor of Anesthesiology. She has had a long, satisfying career spanning 39 years at UTMB.

The most rewarding things in her life have been taking care of patients in the operating room and teaching regional anesthesia and pain medicine. She was also honored by her department for training more than 500 residents and 50 pain fellows over the years.

When she came from England, the American Board of Anesthesiology (ABA) gave her reciprocal recognition for her FRCA as being equivalent to the ABA board certification. This rendered the board examination unnecessary at the time. Despite the ABA recognition in 2008, she was reminded that she was not board-certified and was hurt by this statement. So she undertook the challenge to accomplish it through the avenue of the Alternate Entry Path that was established by the ABA. She completed this challenge with the help of her Chairman Dr. Prough, her colleagues, and her residents. She is very thankful to all of them. She became board-certified in June of 2016. She has told us this was the most fulfilling thing she has ever done and felt her mission was accomplished.

She is very thankful to Dr. Charles R. Tanner for introducing her to the Texas Society of Anesthesiologists and teaching her why it was important to be active in state and national organizations. She has served the Society in the capacity of Director for District 5 from 2001 to 2016 and has enjoyed the experience. Dr. Solanki recently retired on March 31st of 2017 to begin the next chapter in her life.

PROGRAM OBJECTIVES

The practitioner of anesthesiology must possess the scientific background for clinical practice and must maintain state-of-the-art knowledge of not only the specialty, but of all additional related disciplines which may impact it. The anesthesiologist must serve as an expert in matters involving health care delivery, and serve as an informed provider/manager of clinical and educational services. The anesthesiologist must maintain an up-to-the-minute armamentarium of knowledge skills for the selection and use of complex equipment, pharmacological agents and procedures necessary for the provision of quality patient care. As more surgical procedures are performed outside the operating room, anesthesiologists must be familiar with the various clinical settings and medical emergencies with which he/she may be confronted. Anesthesiologists must consistently update their knowledge level and skills. At the conclusion of this CME activity, attendees should be able to:

- Discuss an overview and provide an update on the current administrative regulation and proposed rules from administrative agencies with regulatory authority over their payment and billing in certain payment systems;

- Review principles for pain management in the cancer patient;
- Summarize legislative and regulatory developments affecting pain care in Texas and the USA;
- Discuss the recent FDA Drug and Safety Communication about prolonged or repeated anesthetics in children;
- Review and discuss anesthetic requirements for the EXIT procedure;
- Discuss the prevalence of pain in children with cancer and etiologies of cancer-related pain in children;
- Identify the preoperative considerations in the cancer patient having anesthesia in offsite locations;
- Assess the options and outcomes for weight loss surgery in adolescents and teenagers;
- Describe the pre-anesthetic evaluation of the morbidly obese teenage patient and the comorbidities;

- Recognize the risks of occupational exposure to nitrous oxide, including headaches, fatigue, irritability reproductive risks and nervous system effects;
- Describe the context and need for organ procurement strategies;
- Distinguish the surrogate decision-making for minors from the emancipated minor status;
- Recognize several controversies within the field of pediatric anesthesiology;
- Develop treatment plans to effectively manage the common medical issues encountered within the pediatric perioperative environment;
- Define and describe the prevalence of disruptive behavior in and out of the OR;
- Describe the anesthetic techniques and agents appropriate for patients with left ventricle assist device;
- Acquire familiarity with the pre-operative evaluation and optimization in post-transplant patients;
- Describe the options available for anesthetic management of the obstetric patient in labor with the AICD;
- Create awareness of the fact that each anesthesiologist must exercise greater professional citizenship;
- Define individual actions expected of each ASA member in order to advance the specialty of anesthesiology and secure the future;
- Discuss the importance of physician involvement in the legislative process and review the role of specialties like anesthesiology in carrying out medicine’s agenda;
- Discuss the current political climate as it relates to health care issues and review the current state of major health reforms;
- Recall the anesthetic implications of various cancer therapies;
- Recognize the impact of anemia on tumor growth and progression;
- Discuss the current evidence on perioperative interventions that could influence oncological outcomes;
- Utilize the various techniques available for use in regional anesthesia including the use of ultrasound;
- Define the importance of team-based care and team-based quality indicators;
- Quantify the enormous human burden and adverse economic impact due to lack of universal access worldwide to basic yet often life-saving surgical, obstetrical, and anesthesia care;
- Differentiate the importance of communication, teamwork, and safety culture to the timely recognition and effective management of complications in surgical populations, especially the elderly;
- Discuss the increasing opportunities and capabilities of outcomes measurement, assessment of financial and clinical performance and growing predictive analytics capabilities in health care and likely uses in perioperative medicine; and
- Identify new competencies, skills, and knowledge needed to advance anesthesiology-led perioperative care.
