Be prepped for yoga classes, the annual Fun Run, River Walks, and a trip up Pittsburgh's famous inclines. Friday afternoon is reserved for you to spend some time in Pittsburgh's fall foliage, with a trip to Frank Lloyd Wright's architectural masterpiece, "Fallingwater," a walking tour of local markets, or a visit to one of Pittsburgh's numerous famous museums.
