- Review of current evidence about component specific responses
- Analysis of results of detailed follow-up of a large birth cohort for evidence of food reactions
- The monoclonal Antibody Dupilumab is currently in use for Atopic Dermatitis and has just been approved for asthma above age 12. The evidence also relates to use of the IL-5 specific MAb's
- Evidence related to the use of Cromolyn sodium antihistamines and Xolair. Possible relevance of Tyrosine kinase inhibitors and leukotriene inhibitors as well as the new MAb's
