PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

We at the NCS are actively finalizing plans for our 90th Annual Meeting, which occurs somewhat earlier than usual this year, in September 2016. After a wonderful meeting last November in Amelia Island, Florida, we will return to Chicago; however, unlike previous meetings the new venue for this year's meeting will be the Fairmont Chicago, Millennium Park. This luxurious hotel is located in the heart of the downtown area moments away from Lake Michigan, Grant Park, and many of the city's best shopping and entertainment districts.

I would like to thank Dr. Patrick McKenna, Dr. Gary Faerber, and Dr. Jim Relle and Lisa Katzman for orchestrating a marvelous meeting last November at Amelia Island. As we build on the success of last year's conference, we are fortunate to have Dr. Faerber return as Chair of this year's Program Committee in his final year as NCS Secretary. In addition, we are privileged to have my good friends Drs. Aaron and Amelia Milbank serving as Local Arrangement Chairs for the September 2016 Annual Meeting.

The three day NCS program will begin on September 7, 2016, with a live surgery broadcast of blue-light TURBT and robotic partial nephrectomy, hosted by Dr. Arie Shalhav and faculty from the University of Chicago. Dr. Tomas Griebing will deliver the AUA Course of Choice on Geriatric Urology: The Basic Principles for Urologic Practice.

I am delighted to welcome Drs. Neal Shore and Deepak Kapoor as our esteemed visiting speakers. Dr. Shore is a highly sought speaker and internationally recognized expert on current and emerging therapeutics in urologic oncology. He will speak on advanced prostate cancer therapy, immunologic therapy, and the role of the urologist. He is the Medical Director of the Carolina Urologic Research Center. Dr. Kapoor is a national leader in health policy, and has played an instrumental role in crafting and advocating for urologists around the country in federal regulatory and legislative policy. He will speak on emerging changes in the healthcare landscape that will shape the future delivery of urologic services, regardless of practice type or setting. He is the CEO of Integrated Medical Professionals in New York, which is the largest independent urology group in the US. Further, in addition to their keynote addresses, Drs. Shore and Kapoor will participate in panel discussions on their respective areas of expertise.

Special thanks are owed to Dr. Matthew Gettman, the Section's Health Policy Chair, who once again is implementing a Health Policy and Practice Management forum. There will also be a forum on general urology organized by Dr. Ajay Singla, which will benefit urologists, as well as nurse practitioners, physician assistants and primary care providers. Moreover, new additions to this year's program include special sessions focused on women in urology, co-hosted by Drs. Anne Pelletier Cameron and Elizabeth Takacs, as well as a Program Directors Session hosted by Dr. Jeffrey Triest.

The NCS Board of Directors has approved bylaws changes that will be voted on during the Annual Business Meeting in September. This will include revisions to the definition of "senior member," such that qualification for senior member will require only 20 years service in the Section or AUA rather than reaching age 65. More details regarding this and other aspects of the Annual Meeting will follow in the pre-conference newsletter later this year.

Our section continues to grow and move forward. We remain one of the leading sections in the AUA, and our section has contributed significantly to AUA leadership. In recent years, the NCS has been represented at the AUA officer level by Dr. Dennis Pessis as President, Dr. Richard Memo as Treasurer, and Drs. Robert Flanigan and Monoj Monga as Secretary. This past year, the NCS was once again charged with selecting a nominee for AUA President-Elect. Under the leadership of Dr. Patrick McKenna, NCS Past-President, the section successfully carried out its first ever section-wide ballot to fill this important position. Congratulations to Dr. Robert Flanigan, Urology Chair at the Loyola University Medical Center, who won the election and will be returning to the AUA Board as President-Elect.

It is my honor to serve the North Central Section as President. My wife Nora and I look forward to seeing many of you in Chicago this September for another outstanding Annual Meeting. This year's meeting will highlight emerging changes in both clinical urology and urologic healthcare delivery and health policy. Educational Needs

The Secretary of the North Central Section (Gary Faerber, MD), consulted with other members of the Program Committee and the Executive Committee members, including the current NCS President, Dr. Gary Kirsh; recent past-President, Dr. Patrick McKenna; Secretary-elect, Dr. Jeffrey Triest; Chair of the NCS Education Committee, Dr. Bradley Schwartz; and AUA Secretary, Dr. Manoj Monga, regarding the needs we are attempting to fulfill through our annual scientific program. It was agreed by the above committee members, section officers, and Director of the Office of Education of the AUA that there continues to be significant educational needs for our Annual Meeting and scientific program.

Urologic abnormalities can present with a myriad of clinical symptoms and signs. Accurate differential diagnosis and disease management, which meets current standards of care, requires ongoing review of the presentations of various urologic abnormalities, as well as the appropriate use of safe and cost-effective imaging modalities and various pharmacologic, minimally invasive, and operative management options. In addition, advancements in medical science and progress in management of various urologic diseases require basic and clinical research. Presentation and discussion of such peer-reviewed and abstract reviewer-selected summaries and results of investigations provide "cutting edge" updates for practicing clinicians and essential feedback to researchers on the practical applications and translation of their investigations to clinical practice.

The AUA provided many services and Health Policy support to practicing urologists in the NCS region, and the Past President, AUA Secretary, AUA Chairman of Education, and NCS Board Representative will provide an update on the activities of the AUA.

Educational Objectives

At the conclusion of the 90th Annual Meeting of the NCSAUA, attendees should be able to:

- Apply Evidence Based Medicine (EBM) in urologic practice specifically incorporating AUA Guidelines into daily practice.
- Explain the role of "dusting" as a means of surgical management of renal/ureteral stone disease.
- Explain the evolving role of active surveillance as a treatment strategy for patients with low risk Prostate cancer (LRPC).
- Describe the role of urologists in the management of castrate resistant prostate cancer.
- Analyze data pertaining to various pharmacologic and surgical treatments for voiding dysfunction and urinary incontinence.
- Utilize evidence based treatment algorithms to manage patients with challenging urolithiasis.

- Integrate new and modified treatments for erectile dysfunction, Peyronie's disease, infertility, and use of testosterone.
- Explain the management of superficial and invasive bladder cancer and the associated morbidity and mortality of different methods of treatment.
- Explain coding, physician payment reforms, and a collaborative between payers and providers.
