Technological improvements in radiation therapy have led to enhanced precision in tumour targeting and a reduction in damage to surrounding normal tissue. This has translated to improved cancer outcomes and a significant decrease in serious side effects. GPs play a crucial role in guiding patients through informed decision-making about their cancer treatment, particularly men with prostate cancer who may not be aware that modern radiation therapy is as effective a cure as prostatectomy. This session will update GPs on the significant advances in radiation therapy, its safety, cost-effectiveness and how to support patients during and after therapy.

CARDIOVASCULAR HEALTH

The Post CABG Patient – A GP's Guide to Multi-Modal Care

SATURDAY - SESSION 1 / SUNDAY - SESSION 1
DR BHAVNEET SINGH & DR JAMES FARAG

The GP is front and centre of care after this life-changing event. This activity provides specialist insights into the procedure itself, moving on to the timing of post-op investigations, wound care, pain, management of hypertension, atrial fibrillation, fluid balance and post-operative depression and anxiety. Sternotomy care, physical activity and risks posed by conditions such as obesity, diabetes and renal failure will be a focus of this informative session.

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Hypertension – Management Challenges in the Elderly

New Strategies for Urticaria Management

Urticaria affects up to 20% of the population and is a common reason for specialist referral. Chronic spontaneous urticaria (CSU) – persistent symptoms for 6 weeks or more – often has an auto-immune basis and can be challenging for the GP to manage. This activity outlines the differential diagnosis and investigation of urticaria, with a focus on more effective biologic-based strategies for the treatment of severe CSU, achieved by referral to immunologists and dermatologists.

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EMERGENCY MEDICINE

Managing the Critically Ill Child

Paediatric critical emergencies can be particularly challenging in a medical practice. This course will arm you with the tools to both identify the risks of critical paediatric events and manage the critically ill child in your practice. Part 1 of this 3 hour workshop focusses on identifying the unwell child, crew and team resource management and updates to Advanced Life Support, with Part 2 including airway management, sudden collapse, hypothermia, infection, drowning and trauma.

Advance Care Planning

Enhance your skills in incorporating advance care planning (ACP) conversations into routine care. General practice aims to provide care that is patient centered and delivered in line with a person's goals, beliefs and preferences, particularly as people age and become more likely to have multiple chronic conditions. GPs are therefore well positioned to promote and initiate the ACP conversation.

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EYE HEALTH

Eye Health – Serious Conditions and Emergencies

DR SHANEL SHARMA & DR DAYA SHARMA

This session offers expert guidance on the diagnosis and management of serious eye conditions. Diabetic Retinopathy Screening Masterclass

DR HAMISH DUNN

Recall, assessment, recording and follow up is key to effective screening for diabetic microvascular disease. General practice is the ideal site for screening, particularly for rural and remote patients. New MBS items for diabetic retinopathy screening open up opportunities for GPs to help prevent blindness in the many Australians with diabetes currently missing out on appropriate care. This workshop provides an overview of current diabetic retinopathy screening, with a hands-on opportunity to use the latest networked device designed specifically for primary care.

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GASTROENTEROLOGY

Non Alcoholic Fatty Liver Disease – A Looming Epidemic?

FRIDAY - SESSION 4 / SUNDAY - SESSION 1
PROF MARTIN WELTMAN

With widespread use of new direct-acting antiviral medications, we can expect falling rates of HCV-mediated hepatocellular carcinoma and cirrhosis in the coming decades. Non-alcoholic fatty liver disease now threatens to replace HCV as the cause of a future epidemic of cirrhosis, liver cancer and cardiovascular disease. This activity will guide you through the diagnosis, assessment, management and monitoring of this largely lifestyle-mediated condition.

Hepatitis C Conquered

FRIDAY - SESSION 5 / SUNDAY - SESSION 3

The World Health Organisation recently set the ambitious goal of eliminating hepatitis C as a global public health threat. General practice will be at the frontline of this effort, and Australia is leading the way. This workshop will update GPs on exciting advances in the pharmacologic management of a once incurable disease.

GENETICS

How Genomics Will Change the Way You Practice

FRIDAY - SESSION 4 / SATURDAY - SESSION 4
PROF LESLIE BURNETT

Genetic and genomic testing is increasingly available to patients through healthcare providers and online services. This session will help you navigate the current and future uses of genetics and genomics in primary care, the types of tests available, and the strengths and limitations of different methods. It will also provide tips for supporting patients through testing and case studies of where testing may be used to individualise treatment or support preventive strategies.

MEN'S HEALTH

Androgen Therapy – Where Are They Now?

FRIDAY - SESSION 1 / SUNDAY - SESSION 4

The role of testosterone replacement therapy in older men with modest declines in serum testosterone remains controversial, and many endocrinologists no longer approve androgen therapy in older men. But has the pendulum swung too far? This session will explore the evidence, who to treat, and alternative approaches to managing symptoms of testosterone decline.

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MENTAL HEALTH

Perinatal Mental Health – Early Identification and Effective Management

SATURDAY - SESSION 5 / SUNDAY - SESSION 3
DR VERED GORDON

Depression and anxiety are common throughout perinatal period, affecting around 1 in 6 mothers and 1 in 10 fathers. Identifying and effectively managing perinatal mental health issues confers a range of both short and long-term benefits, not only for parents, but for the developing infant and the family unit as a whole. This session will help you to recognise risk factors and warning signs for perinatal depression and anxiety, and update your knowledge regarding current management approaches, including the use of anti-depressants in the perinatal period.

Benzodiazepines – Practical Approaches for the GP

FRIDAY - SESSION 3 / SUNDAY - SESSION 4
DR MICHAEL NICHOLAS, DR SIMON HOLLIDAY & MR JOHN STEVENS

Long term benzodiazepine use is associated with risk of physical and psychological dependence. The elderly are particularly vulnerable, with significantly increased adverse effects, including falls and fractures. This session discusses appropriate benzodiazepine prescribing and deprescribing, with a focus on CBT upskilling for the time-poor GP to facilitate positive management of symptoms that initially led to the prescription.

Depression Management for GPs

SATURDAY - SESSION 4 / SUNDAY - SESSION 4

This case-based workshop outlines a patient-centred approach to depression management. Update your skills to tailor medications to patient symptoms, enhancing efficacy with minimal side effects and increasing the likelihood of treatment success.

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MUSCULOSKELETAL HEALTH

Osteoporosis – What the GP Needs To Do

FRIDAY - SESSION 5 / SATURDAY - SESSION 1
PROF MARK COOPER

In NSW/ACT in 2018 there will be over 57,000 fractures due to poor bone health. This session reviews the active investigation of osteoporosis in general practice to reduce initial and repeat fractures, the 'real' story on treatment efficacy and treatment duration and clear up confusion from recent media on the role of calcium and vitamin D. Also an exciting glimpse of what is on the horizon.

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The Troublesome Knee – What Does and Doesn't Work?

FRIDAY - SESSION 4 / SUNDAY - SESSION 4

Knee pain can be a management challenge for the GP. How useful is routine imaging? Which patients should be targeted for non-pharmacologic treatments? When should joint replacement be considered? Is there evidence to support injections? This session will increase your confidence in managing this common condition for better outcomes.

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NEUROLOGY

Headache Refresher

FRIDAY - SESSION 5 / SUNDAY - SESSION 1

Correct diagnosis of headache is critical in general practice. This session reviews the differential diagnosis and management of headache, focussing on the recognition of red flags for emergency intervention. Evidence-based pharmacological and non-pharmacological management options are reviewed.

PAEDIATRICS

Acute Respiratory Presentation in Children

FRIDAY - SESSION 5 / SUNDAY - SESSION 5
DR JOHN WIDGER

This session outlines effective approaches to the assessment, differential diagnosis and management of acute respiratory distress in children. History-taking essentials, important signs and symptoms, appropriate investigations and red flags for emergency referral are all discussed in this case-based activity.

PAIN MANAGEMENT

CBT Approaches to the Management of Chronic Non-Cancer Pain

FRIDAY - SESSION 4 / SUNDAY - SESSION 4
DR BLAKE DEAR

The evidence supporting psychological interventions for the management of chronic non-cancer pain is growing. Dr Blake Dear, Clinical Psychologist and developer of the MindSpot Clinic's online pain management program, will discuss the use of CBT for chronic pain, the evidence for its effectiveness, practical approaches to implementing CBT in general practice, and some of the available online resources for general practice. The session will be introduced by Arthritis Australia.

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Complexities in Pain – The Inherited Patient

FRIDAY - SESSION 3 / SATURDAY - SESSION 3

When a new chronic pain patient requests a repeat script for an opioid, the GP is challenged to decide if this is the appropriate course of action. The inherited patient may be on a reasonable and appropriate course of therapy, managed in a way not consistent with the GP's own clinical practice, or on therapy not appropriate or defensible. This session provides a guide to socio-psycho-biomedical pain assessment, risk assessment for problematic opioid behaviours, discusses the benefits and risks of opioid therapy and obligations regarding opioid prescribing, and explains how to establish realistic, measurable goals based on function.

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PRACTICE MANAGEMENT

My Health Record – The Essential Guide for GPs

FRIDAY - SESSION 3 / SUNDAY - SESSION 3

Usability improvements have made the eHealth record system more accessible and easier to use. This workshop will guide you through the system, including assisting patients to register, helping patients to manage their record, linkage of patient records with Individual Healthcare Identifiers and issues around privacy and security.

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PUBLIC HEALTH

A Beginner's Guide to E-cigarettes – Are They Safe, Effective, Legal?

FRIDAY - SESSION 1 / SATURDAY - SESSION 1 / SUNDAY - SESSION 1

A/PROF COLIN MENDOLSOHN

E-cigarettes are being increasingly used by your patients and GPs need to be informed with the latest evidence. We discuss how they work, their safety, effectiveness, legal issues and practical guidelines for counselling patients on their use. An ex-smoker who now vapes will also tell his story.

Patient Participation in the National Bowel Cancer Screening Program

FRIDAY - SESSION 3

In NSW, bowel cancer is the second most common cancer and the second biggest cancer killer. However, we know that patients report barriers to participating in the free National Bowel Cancer Screening Program. The topic of bowel cancer screening can be difficult to discuss with your patients, but GPs are very well placed to help increase screening participation rates. This session offers skills to help you to start and maintain conversations with your patients about the importance of bowel cancer screening, and encourage participation in the National Bowel Cancer Screening Program.

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REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH

The GP's Role in Fertility Assessment and Management

FRIDAY - SESSION 4 / SATURDAY - SESSION 3

Around 1 in 6 Australian couples are affected by infertility. GPs are the first port of call for the infertile couple - investigating the possible cause(s), counselling, management or referral to reproductive specialists. In this session, targeted history, examination and investigations for infertility will be discussed, with guidance on interpretation in order to counsel and tailor a management plan for the couple.

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Vasectomy in General Practice

SATURDAY - SESSION 3 / SUNDAY - SESSION 5

Vasectomy is a safe and effective procedure, performed more often by GPs than specialists in Australia. This session is useful for those already performing vasectomies, as well as those considering training. The no-scalpel procedure is described, before moving on to discuss risk minimisation, after-care, complications and follow up testing.

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RESPIRATORY HEALTH

Inhaler Masterclass

FRIDAY - SESSION 4 / SATURDAY - SESSION 3

Poor inhaler technique significantly impairs delivery of medication, leading to sub-optimal control of asthma and COPD. This masterclass demonstrates the features of the wide range of inhalers now available, explains the common mistakes patients make when using their inhalers, and provides practical tips for the doctor to help ensure that patients are using inhalers optimally. Participants will have the opportunity to examine and use the inhalers featured in the masterclass.

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Managing Patients with COPD at Risk of Exacerbations

FRIDAY - SESSION 3 / SATURDAY - SESSION 4

While the course of COPD involves slow progressive deterioration in airflow, it is punctuated by exacerbations, many of which require hospitalisation and are associated with higher mortality. This session will focus on the clinical evidence supporting the different inhaled therapies for COPD, as well as a review of a new COPD medicine combining two long-acting bronchodilators plus an anti-inflammatory to control symptoms and reduce risk of exacerbations.

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Efficacy and Effectiveness – the changing world of medicine evaluation

SATURDAY - SESSION 5 / SUNDAY - SESSION 1

Randomized controlled trials (RCTs) are considered to be the 'gold standard' for evaluating treatment outcomes and providing information on a treatment's 'efficacy'. They are designed to test a therapeutic hypothesis under optimal conditions. Conversely, studies conducted in a general practice environment can provide information on the 'effectiveness' of a treatment; the measure of the extent to which an intervention does what is intended to do in the real world. This session considers what effectiveness evidence is, and how it can complement that from classical RCTs.

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SURGICAL SKILLS

Surgical Skills – Basic Techniques

FRIDAY - SESSION 3 / SATURDAY - SESSION 4 / SUNDAY - SESSION 3

This practical masterclass covers dermatologic surgery essentials for the GP. Biopsy techniques (punch and shave), simple ellipse excisions and minor wound repairs are the focus, with guidance on planning excisions, wound care principles, suture materials and opportunities to practice a range of techniques including layered closure, deep sutures, mattress sutures and dog ear repairs.

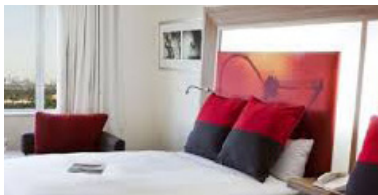

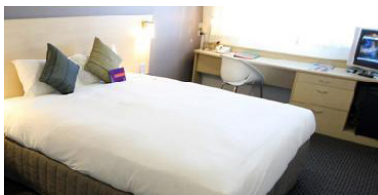

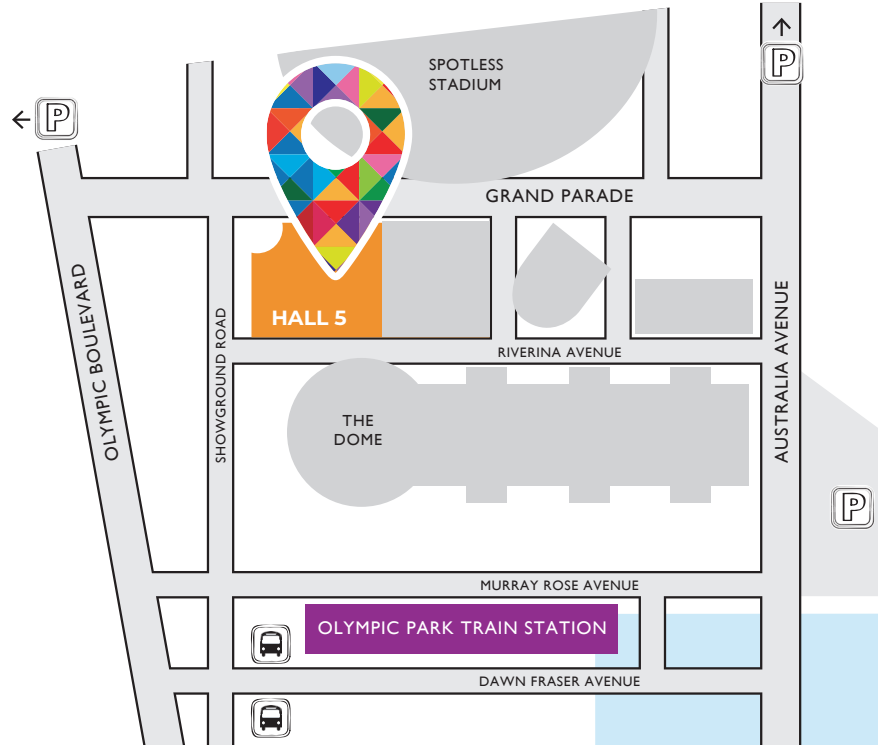

BY TRAIN

BY CAR AND PARKING:

Sydney Olympic Park is easily approached by road via the M4 – Silverwater Road (from the west), Victoria Road (from the North), M4 - Parramatta Road (from the east).
