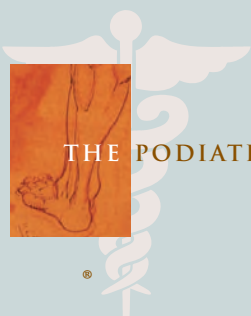

DISTINGUISHED FACULTY

The faculty for this course has extensive experience in total ankle arthroplasty with a collective cohort of over 2000 implants and 200 revisions. They have contributed extensively to the total ankle literature and have developed many of the techniques in wide use today. They have also trained over 100 surgeons throughout the United States in ankle arthroplasty.

Jeffrey C. Christensen, DPM practices in the greater Seattle area and is an attending surgeon at Swedish Medical Center in Seattle. He has specialized in complex reconstructive foot and ankle surgery for 29 years, which includes experience with the currently available implants. Dr. Christensen has presented over 400 regional, national, and international lectures and written over 85 papers and book chapters on foot and ankle surgery including total ankle replacement. He is founder and director of the Northwest Surgical Biomechanics Laboratory at Swedish Medical Center.

John M. Schubert, DPM is Chief of Foot and Ankle Surgery at Kaiser San Francisco with a high volume surgical practice emphasizing complicated reconstructions and ankle replacement. He has over 120 publications in foot and ankle surgery.

Jerome K. Steck, DPM practices with Southern Arizona Orthopedics and trained and practiced with Frank Alvine MD, the inventor of the Agility ankle implant. His experience in implant arthroplasty is widespread and has developed instrumentation specific for total ankle arthroplasty that is in use today.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

Upon completion of this course, participants will have had exposure to the most up-to-date information on the entire spectrum of total ankle arthroplasty that includes:

- Understand the parameters of ankle arthritis with respect to total ankle replacement. The participant will understand what segregates ankle arthritis from other lower extremity weight bearing joints.
- Understand the biomechanics of the total ankle with particular attention to the available components in the United States.
- Be able to develop reliable perioperative protocols that will improve outcomes and diminish complications.
- Will understand the strategies to manage severe frontal plane deformities with all of the available implants. specific reconstructive strategies will be provided.
- Be knowledgeable of anterior or posterior talolisthesis, equinus, and suprastructural deformities with specific intraoperative maneuvers.
- Understand modifications to standard protocols when dealing with complicated preop conditions.
- Be informed about the management of the usual complications of total ankle arthroplasty including infection, subsidence, recurrent deformities and bone loss.
- Understand complex revision ankle arthroplasty.
- Know the conditions and technique of ankle fusion take-downs.
