SUMMARY: The purpose of this course is to provide a knowledge base on the diagnosis of dysphagia and speech deficits and treatment strategies including use of tracheoesophageal prosthesis (TEP) for individuals diagnosed with head and neck cancers. Characteristics and functional impact of head and neck lymphedema on speech, swallowing and quality of life will be reviewed. The importance of a multi-disciplinary team approach in the treatment of head and neck cancer will also be discussed. (Introductory Level)

She specializes in adult speech, language, and swallowing disorders, with an interest in head and neck cancer. Catherine completed her doctoral work at Adelphi University. Her doctoral focus was on the effects of deep brain stimulation surgery on speech and language function via pre-, intra-, and post-operative assessment. Her current research focus is on the assessment of swallowing dysfunction after SBRT for HN Cancers. Catherine maintains membership in the American Speech Language Hearing Association (ASHA) and the Dysphagia Research Society.

Kristin Beadle, M.S., CCC-SLP, CLT is the Senior Administrative Manager at Long Island Jewish Medical Center. She specializes in treatment of patients with head and neck cancer and has held several lectures on rehabilitation for the laryngectomy patients at the Long Island Chapter of SPOHNC. Kristin has published in the *Cureus Journal of Medical Science* on the topic of head and neck cancer. Kristin has taught graduate level courses at Adelphi University. She holds the Certificate of Clinical Competence from the American Speech Language Hearing Association (ASHA) and is a member of ASHA's Special Interest Group 13. She is a certified Lymphedema Therapist. She is also a board member of the Hearing and Speech Society and co-director of the Hearing and Speech Laryngectomy Support Group.
